In the Interim

If you have checked the bulletin board in the breezeway, you have seen the transcription of the data and some artwork from the Vision Retreat. The Transition Team took that data and created individual drafts of a combined vision. Then two of the team members made an attempt at pulling those five drafts together. Below you will see what has been sent to the Council AND TO YOU for input and revision.

FIRST COMBINED DRAFT

We are the Body of Christ—people on a shared journey bound to one another as those who ride in the same canoe—people bound to God through the call of Jesus Christ. Because we know God's love and acceptance, we accept one another and travel together with our diversity and differences. When the sea becomes unpredictable, we trust God and one another to direct KCC as we paddle together and encourage one another even when changes in course are not to everyone's liking.

We strive to embody Jesus' teachings of justice and love by expressing those values in personal, congregational and community actions and attitudes. We are members of the vine that is Christ (John 15:5) bearing good fruit in our service to one another and our larger community. KCC is a safe place to practice discernment through Bible study, unceasing prayer (1 Thessalonians 5:16–18), and working to transform ourselves and the world because together we are God's salt and light (Matthew 5:13–16).

SECOND COMBINED DRAFT

A CHURCH LIVING FOR THE WORLD

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Kailua Christian Church is following the will of God who is our redeemer; our first love; our teacher and provider. As a congregation we strive to work together as a church community side by side, helping local and worldwide ministries. KCC is a church that is a safe place to practice discernment through Bible study and prayer to understand where God is leading it to transform itself and the world.

JESUS VISION OF RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS

Like a canoe on a long voyage being led by the Holy Spirit, remain focused on praying and encouraging each other when the sea of life becomes unpredictable. Forgiving with compassion for our enemies and through it all staving true to ourselves and to others through our love and obedience to God. "Set your mind on things that are above, not on things that are on earth" (Colossians 3:2). We know with faith we can move mountains, for with God nothing is impossible. We are bound together by the love we share working together, accepting differences, forgiving one another, sharing joys and sorrow, and encouraging one another with mutual support. We rely on God for guidance as we love with no judgments, forgive and trust each other, welcome and be open to all, and embracing diversity.

MODEL FOR PRAYING AND ACTING God through his son Jesus Christ gave us a gift called the Holy Spirit who dwells within us.

We must pray without ceasing. "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in" (Matthew 25:35). A church who uses their hands to do God's work. Continue caring not only for one another but for those outside our physical walls in order to best serve God and a diverse population. Our prayers are for the community and world will be answered by evangelizing to neighbors and friends.

As you can see, we still have some work to do to pull the Vision into another draft for the Congregation to consider. However, the Transition Team welcomes your input so that we can present the best work possible to the congregation. All you need to do is to give your suggestions and drafts to anyone on the Transition Team (Debbie Fong, Dan Jessee, Karel Ling, Vernon Pang, Roy Yamauchi and Jack Belsom).

Please continue praying for the team and the Council as we work with you to discern God's vision for Kailua Christian Church.

MODERATOR'S NOTES

The Transition Team is working on the first draft of KCC Vision Statement. It will then be shared with the Council, and then presented to the congregation. It has been suggested that the congregation meet in small groups to review our Vision Statement. You might ask how this

is relevant to our pastoral search process. Our Vision Statement will become part of our Church Profile, which will be received by each pastor applying for the position at KCC. The

prospective pastors can then determine if their individual gifts would be relevant to where God has called KCC and how they might be able to shepherd KCC to that calling.

Everyone who is interested in being part of the *Pastoral Search Committee* is invited to attend a preliminary meeting after service on Sunday July 17th. I understand that many were discouraged by the time commitments projected. If you have an interest but have time limitations, I would encourage you to attend as we will try to work these challenges out. I would encourage all who are interested to attend.

Your Council will be looking at our Bylaws to update them in relation to the current size of our congregation as well as how the environment that our church exists in has evolved. We live in a very different world of even 10 years ago. Of course the internet is a big part of this change, but how people have adapted to this resource is astounding. Shopping, paying, learning, communicating, and the list goes on and is evolving every day. I believe if KCC is going to remain relevant in the lives of current and future members, we must take advantage of every element that the world around us adopted. As only one example, we have contracted to have our website updated, understanding that many today, especially young adults, rely on these sites to determine what church to visit.

I can tell you that we will learn about and utilize as many of these new technologies as possible to let our community know who we are and what we are doing, and be assured that our focus will always be where God is leading us and not what we as individuals think is best for our church.

YOUTH TO NATIONAL YOUTH EVENT

This month, Grace Myers, Rayn Jessee and Katie Gomes will be joining 39 other Hawaii youth in attending the United Church of Christ National Youth Event at Coronado Springs Resort in Orlando, Florida. The Oahu Association youth contingency is made up of 22 youth and eight chaperones from KCC, Nuuanu Congregational Church, Judd Street UCC, Crossroads, Pearl City Community Church and Nuu Lotu.

The remainder of the youth are from the Tri-Isle Association and the Big Island Association.

Oahu fundraising efforts provided each KCC youth participant with over \$700 in registration, excess housing and food costs. They also received \$500 from KCC and \$200 from the Maile Vesper Ito fund and through an offering taken at the 2016 Aha Pae'aina. The Oahu Association funding effort under the acronym HI2NYE received substantial support from Oahu churches, with specific grants generating from the members of the Women's League of Central Union Church, the Woman's Board of Mission for the Pacific Islands, Windward United Church of Christ, and Matson Ka Ipu 'Aina project. The youth also thank all of the KCC individuals who contributed to their fundraising efforts.

Please pray for a successful trip for the youth as they arrive in Florida on July 24th and for the duration of their stay until July 30th. Our Hawaii youth will be representing the Hawaii Conference with a sharing of songs and dances at a July 27 worship service. Stay tuned for more information on their experiences!


