

# IN THE INTERIM

We are on our annual journey through Lent to Easter, and we look forward to the familiar celebrations of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter. I am grateful for those who talked to me about what KCC has done in the past, and that will guide us this year.

We have finished our study of the Beatitudes and are using what we have learned to start to pull together a proposed vision—who we are and what God is calling us to be and do. We will continue with one more study that focuses specifically on vision, and the four sessions will be held between Easter and Pentecost. During that process, the Transition Team will share with you each stage of the process to make sure your input has been heard and respected. A draft of the vision will be developed and shared to get even more feedback and direction from the congregation. The Transition Team wants to be sure that vision flows from what we have learned.

Similarly, the Transition Team is compiling responses to "Tell Me a Story about Being Church" that many of you have helped with. The Deacons are also scheduling time to gather even more input so we can identify KCC's core values and commitments. Once again drafts of those will be shared for feedback and refinement. We are looking for what stands at the heart of this congregation.

All of work helps us answer the questions: "Who are we? What is most important to us?"

How has our history shaped us? Where are we now in relation to the community? And what is God calling KCC to be and do?" When we have a strong consensus on all of those, we will have the basis of "Profile" that the Pastoral Search Committee can use. We are targeting June as a time to have this work ready for consensus. Following that, a Pastoral Search Committee will be formed according to KCC's bylaws, and it will what we have done together to search for a candidate with the gifts and skills that will help KCC move toward God's vision for the church.

There is another benefit to this important work. Members are talking about what they believe, sharing how God is working among us and praying for the future ministry of this church. Please continue to pray for the Transition Team, your church leaders and me as we work to follow our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

#### **MODERATOR'S NOTES**

We are now approaching the end of our first six months of our interim pastoral period. I know it has been difficult to understand what the process is and why we are going through it as it has taken this long for me to fully grasp it.

Let me say first that our "process" of discernment, education, deliberation, and prayer brought us to calling Pastor Jack as our interim and his first six months has been a testament to this process. I believe he has been everything that we expected in calling him. This is not to say that it has been easy, since we needed to be exposed, challenged, taught, as well as cared for and supported. I understand that for some of us, it has been challenging since it was not business as usual.

It would seem that the search for a new settled pastor is pretty straight forward. Get a group of congregants together and come to some kind of agreement of what everyone would like to see in the new pastor and find the candidate who comes closest to that description. Get it over quickly and cause minimum disruption in the life of our church. That path would assuredly lead to power struggles resulting in winners and losers (with good intentions by everyone). Our current process will give us a unified focus and a chance at achieving unity through consensus.

The interim period has presented KCC with a unique opportunity of discernment, reflection, assessment and visioning. KCC and the world that it exists in has evolved, having said this, I believe we have always been a faithful Christian body, grounded in the Bible and guided if not transformed by Jesus, God and the Holy Spirit and we will continue on that path.

We will embark on another series of Bible studies assisted by the Center for Parish Development

which also provided the study materials for our study of the Beatitudes. I would encourage your participation in this effort so that you might experience where God wants his church to be.


