IN THE INTERIM

VISION RETREAT-SATURDAY, MAY 14

What is God's vision for Kailua Christian Church? That question has been before us for several months. We have studied the Bible, prayed together, and worked to discern elements of that vision. Now it is time for the congregation to come together to integrate that prior Bible study with the hopes and dreams of all the congregation as we seek to discern God's Vision Saturday, May 14 from 8:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the church.

What are the goals of the Vision Retreat?

- Join hearts and minds in a communal discernment process
- Learn together through worship, study, reflection, and fellowship
- Provide input to the expression of a Guiding Vision for our church

We will work in table groups with facilitators during that time. There will be opportunities for singing and praying, lots of good food and fellowship, experiences of listening and sharing, as well as the posting of insights on newsprint. Those newsprint notes will enable a small group to express in writing a Guiding Vision for Kailua Christian Church. That Guiding Vision will be presented to the congregation for review, modification and adoption.

As a part of the retreat, the Council will share its assessment of those challenges that must be addressed both now and in the future when the church calls its new pastor. That description of the current situation will challenge us to discover

what opportunities we have as we build on the strengths of this congregation for ministry.

These two elements—the Guiding Vision and the Assessment of the Current Situation—will be used by your Pastoral Search Committee, which will begin its work in June. They will also be used to shape the ministry in this interim period.

You are key to having this discernment process reflect the heart, mind and soul of Kailua Christian Church. Your deacon will be contacting you to encourage you to participate and to coordinate transportation for you if that will help you.

We believe we will make the best decisions when as many as possible bring their gifts together to discern God's will. I look forward to seeing you May 14 from 8:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., and I expect that God will work through us to offer us a surprising vision of God's future for Kailua Christian Church.

TRUSTEE'S TIDBITS



First quarter giving statements were prepared and recently distributed. The Trustees feel

that most of the errors from the year end 2015 statements were the result of multiple giving accounts for the same family. We hope that we have consolidated most of the accounts. KCC giving is recorded in the computer using a program called Church Windows. It provides the ability to store data in an orderly fashion, but with any other program, what goes in will come out the way it goes in. Your Trustees have been trying to learn to use Church Windows efficiently. We were very much dependent upon Jane Shiroma, who left us at the beginning of 2015; and, we had a huge

learning curve. Once again, our apologies to any of you who experienced errors in 2015. We encourage you to look at your first quarter reports and share any concerns that you may have. This will assist us in getting our computer files more accurate.

The Trustees held their April board meeting and once again took up the matter of a photovoltaic system for KCC. Due to Public Utilities Commission changes in late 2015, the GEMS program, through which KCC had planned to seek financing for a system, was closed down. William McKillop, the GEMS project manager extended his sincerest regret that the state subsidized program would not be The Trustees, with the available to KCC. assistance of Moderator Roy Yamauchi are still considering a potential power purchase agreement and other alternatives to making KCC an energy efficient property. comment or information you may have to offer is encouraged. Recent significant expenses for the church have included the installation of a new split air conditioning system for the office, plumbing and electrical improvements and repairs, the trimming of the monkey pod tree, cleaning of some of the sanctuary chairs, replacement of a broken kitchen stove, insurance and other annually required fees, Bible study materials and transition process study, and the improvement of our KCC

website. The office will also be receiving a new copier as the lease on the old one is up. The new unit will not have the fax function as most documents can now be scanned and transmitted electronically. We continue to research the different alternatives in cleaning the drapes.

Although stewardship is highlighted in the Fall, our recent needs suggest the prudence in assuring the Congregation that while the Trustees are attempting to be faithful in utilizing KCC's financial resources, there are needs and situations that require us to expend Church funds, that are not daily operational costs. We remain a living church and wanting

to continue to be responsive to the needs of our world and community, your support is gratefully received and utilized.


