Pastoral Search Committee Report

Your Pastoral Search Committee (PSC) has come to the conclusion of a very lengthy and time consuming process, which required many meetings to determine who it is that God wants to lead KCC into the future. Leaving individual wants and desires behind, the team made efforts to be inspired by the Spirit and to hold all of you in our hearts as we searched for someone to heal us and to inspire us to become the church that Jesus envisioned. We listened to each other, sometimes seeing qualities in different candidates that we felt would be good for KCC. We were not moved by any candidates in the first group and asked for more profiles to review.

After reviewing 38 profiles and interviewing five ministers, it was with an enormous sense of relief, that after interviewing and looking in to the background of one particular candidate, the team was unanimous in its belief that we had found someone to share their life with KCC. (We had initially agreed to come to consensus as a way to make our decisions that is, if you did not totally feel this was the right person, could you accept the reasons shared by others to come to consensus with the rest of the team. We were surprised that ours was a unanimous agreement.) This candidate possessed many of the qualities and characteristics that were discussed by the PSC and during discussions facilitated by the Transition Team and from the Moderator's conversations. We had some concerns, and we were forthright in asking him to address them. His answers allayed the reservations we had about him. Feel-

ing so elated, we offered to the Congregation that we were close to selecting someone, but had to present this person to the Council. After meeting with the Council, strong reservations were surfaced to the extent that the Search Committee met again on September 24 for further discussion. We were able to come to consensus and the PSC remains in support of his call. This was shared with the Moderator and he will begin the process to call a Congregational meeting for the 15th of October. You should be receiving information about the candidate and informing you of the Congregational meeting. We expect that the candidate will also preach at KCC and be available at two meet and greet sessions the Saturday before to answer your questions, with proposed times being 10AM and 4PM. Please stay tuned to our website (KailuaChristianChurch.org) and any announcements during worship for more information on the upcoming events.

We continue to ask for your prayers for KCC!

However, the work to find a candidate is not done yet. We need all members to come to the Saturday, October 14, 2017, meet and greet. There you will be able to meet the candidate, and ask any questions you have concerning his past or how he envisions leading our congregation. We also need all members to attend the congregational meeting on Sunday, October 15, 2017. As a congregational church, each member has a vote to determine if the candidate presented by the pastoral search committee is one they feel called to lead our church. Each member has an important role in the future of our beloved KCC. A secret ballot will be held at the congregational meeting. A two-thirds majority vote of members present will result in the acceptance of the candidate being called to KCC as its pastor.

I encourage all members to ask any questions you have regarding the candidate or the process and we will do our best to assist you.

DEACON NEWS

This last month the Benevolence Fund helped three individuals with their rent for a total of \$525.



According to the Board of Deacons Handbook, the purpose of the Deacons Benevolence Fund is as follows:

- 1. To assist with the financial needs of those who are unable to provide for themselves.
- 2. To provide resources for ministries that give support and care to individuals or families.

The Board of Deacons has complete jurisdiction over this fund. To ask for assistance the individual needs to come in and apply in person. Sometimes they arrive with a friend or support person they have asked for a ride, but more often they catch the bus. The applicants are not limited to the windward side but often come from areas far from Kailua. After submitting their application they then need to come back to the church a second time for a face to face interview with the deacons.

As a deacon, it is sometimes difficult to determine whether a person is able or unable to provide for him/herself. As the administrators of this fund we need to be conscientious of how we disburse the funds. There is a slim line between providing for a genuine need and enabling an individual to not take responsibility. To this we ask for your prayers.

Pray for those who apply for assistance. Pray for the deacons who disburse the funds. Pray for our members and friends (and for those who are not our members and friends) who are lonely, ill, or missing a loved one.

And since we are asking for prayers, may I add on a few more . . .

Pray for our church in transition as we wait for a settled pastor.

Pray for the KCC leaders and pastoral search committee as they work together.

Pray that we will treat each other with love and respect.

And beyond our little community in Kailua . . . Pray for the leaders of our nation and the world and fill them with wisdom and compassion.


