In the Interim

How do you put together a budget? Situations change. Children go off to college or move out, a family member retires, income increases or decreases, medical insurance increases, etc. When there is a change, we need to stop and assess our priorities. What is most important for us in 2017? We do that with our families, and we do that as a church.

If everything is stable and we believe income and expenses will remain the same, we simply take last year's budget and make minor adjustments. However, if we have to attend two graduations on the mainland, our travel budget may be significantly higher. Budgets usually tell us what we believe is important.

Kailua Christian Church UCC needs to fund the Pastoral Search and prepare for calling, possibly moving, and welcoming a settled pastor. Those are not expenses the church has had to address for some time. In addition, your Council has recommended to you three priorities:

- We need to experience the Body of Christ in our work and ministry. We make sure we support one another by sharing our faith and our ideas freely with each other, learning to welcome and accept our differences in ways that are caring, and accepting people who are different from us.
- 2) Leadership development.
- 3) Evaluating/reviewing ministries and processes—how are we organized for

ministry? Are we building on our strengths?

A budget based on goals begins with plans to achieve those goals. It asks, "What resources

(personnel, funds, time, equipment, etc.) do we need?" It prioritizes the budget so that first things are first.

One process we may want to use with our committees, the Council and the Pastoral Search Committee is called a SWOT Analysis. We analyze our Strengths, our Weaknesses, any Opportunities and any Threats. Too often we fret over our Weaknesses instead of taking a good look at our Strengths. If we try to find create ways to build on our Strengths to seize opportunities that God is presenting, we probably will get more done than bemoaning our Weaknesses. Oh, yes, we do need to take any Threats seriously. In the time I have been in ministry with you, I have not picked up on any immediate Threats.

By building on our Strengths, we can put first things first and be ready to welcome the Opportunities that God will present. The Apostle writes, "[God says,] 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' I will all the more gladly boast of my weaknesses, that the power of Christ may rest upon me" (2 Corinthians 12:9 NRSV). With that assurance, we don't even have to worry about our weakness.

Let's trust God to use us and this interim to move us toward God's vision for Kailua Christian Church UCC. Your servant in Christ,

MODERATOR'S NOTES

I have been getting some feedback from comments that I've heard regarding our Pastoral Search process, which really started with the search for an interim pastor almost a year ago. Some of these comments reflect the thought that we "just need to get it over with".

I am a big believer in "process". I think the best way to explain it is to compare process with a recipe in baking. If we wanted to bake a special cake for someone, we would probably think of the best example we had ever tasted and try to get that recipe, or not having that taste experience, going to a cookbook that thoroughly tests many recipes for that type of cake and coming up with the "best". In other words, trying to eliminate chance and insure certainty.

So KCC has contracted with the Centers for Parish Development to help us with the "recipe" and we have retained the "chef" who has trained in the interim process, Pastor Jack. In baking this "cake", we have learned much in our Bible studies and retreats. Who we are, what our core values and strengths are, what our vision is for our future, and most of all, how to discern where God wants this church as opposed to where you or I want this church to be.

So I would ask that you pray for us, the Pastoral Search Committee, as we head for the home stretch in this process; Paul Grable, Robert St. John, Debbie Glenn, Karel Ling, Deb Fong, Myrtle Terada, June Tom, Joan Sakaba and me, as the non-voting facilitator.

TRUSTEE'S TIDBITS

On Easter Sunday of 1966, congregants held their first service in the nearly completed Kailua Christian Church. (See KCC's history website: new on our Fifty years www.kailuachristianchurch.org). later, KCC's structures continue to serve its congregation well. Many though now wonder what the future holds for this church. This sentiment is shared amongst many churches worldwide. Worship and faith of 50 years ago is no longer the same; maintaining church buildings are in many cases becoming a source of concern for church leaders.

KCC is in an interim period, seeking a new settled pastor and seeking ways to keep the church relevant. The Tri-Isle Association of the United Church Christ (Maui-Lanai-Molokai churches of Hawaii Conference) has sponsored several seminars to address these concerns. KCC, through the assistance of Pastor Jack has been invited to share in one of these sessions. June Tom, Roy Yamauchi and Gary Nham have volunteered to attend "Part II: Practicum: Recasting Your Church's Assets," during the weekends of October 21 and 28. They will be working with Sally O'Brien of the Episcopal Church Fund (ECBF), who will present an innovative hands-on consultation process. The aim of the process is to help congregations identify their place in the community - to understand their relevance; to build mission and value in the world around them, and to use their real estate assets to develop financial selfsustainability. Congregational development is not the strategy for increasing parish income. The intent of this process is to invigorate parish life, and create new, dynamic relationships

within the community, resulting in common mission and new people experiencing a fulfilling relationship with the church."

The three objectives of the session are: 1) develop financial self-sustainability through the creative use of buildings and property; 2)

create relevancy by developing relationships in the outside community; 3) disperse or reallocate real-estate assets which are redundant or cannot be sustained; and 4) inspire new ways to be a thriving church.

Ms. O'Brien is the Vice President of the Episcopal Church Building Fund for 24 years. She started out working with congregations which were conducting building projects. In recent years, as more churches struggle to maintain their church property because of dwindling membership, they began to work with churches that are reinventing how they do church, sometimes through new uses of their real estate." Ms O'Brien has also helped church leaders become "more adept at managing the natural kind of conflict that happens with groups, like families and congregations," as they move through change.

KCC's team's participation has been supported primarily with funds received by the Tri-Isle Association and by Pastor Jack.

We keep in mind, Ms. O'Brien's belief, "I don't know much, but I know this, if we follow the Spirit there will be life." We look forward to learning from June, Gary, Roy, Pastor Jack and Ms. O'Brien.
