I also want to remind you that the past year has been spent in activities that will prepare us for our future; Bible studies, Visioning Retreat, and the Transition Team projects. Our first meeting of the Pastoral Search Committee took place on Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> and was very productive. They have been productive and people have been honest. These conversations have been going on at our Bible studies and recently our Council meetings and will go a long way in directing our path forward.

Continued prayers for our Search Committee members who are serving on our behalf. Mahalo for their commitment of time and energy to complete this process to help us select our new pastor.






