#### In the Interim

On January 6 we moved into the season of Epiphany. That's the season between January 6 and Ash Wednesday, which will be March 1 this year. It is a season when the church reflects on how God is seen in the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth. The Greek roots of the word suggest that it means to "sound through." Those who saw and heard Jesus heard God sounding through his ministry.

The Western Church has focused on the image of light. That explains why the paraments (the cloths on the altar) are white. It used to remain white until Ash Wednesday, but now you probably noticed that it stayed white through January 8 and then changed to green. The first Sunday after Epiphany is a day that we remember the Baptism of Jesus.

In the Eastern Church the focus was on baptism and water. That explains the green color. They remember all the times that God used water to bring about the "salvation" of God's people. We remember crossing the Red Sea and crossing the Jordan. We also remember that Jesus was baptized in the water of the Jordan River, and Jesus identified himself as "living water" to the woman at the Samaritan well. We all celebrate the gift of Christ as living water for all.

Epiphany gives us the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of our baptism. In baptism, we respond to God's call to us, and we are commissioned for ministry. We are called and sent. When someone is baptized as an infant or a child, they usually recognize that Christ is sending them out into the world at confirmation. Regardless of how we were baptized or when we were baptized, the meaning is the same, we live into our baptism for the rest of our lives.





## KCC TRANSITIONAL HOUSING MINISTRY UPDATE

We celebrate the current partnership of Institute of Hawaii (IHS) and KCC in providing a transitional housing apt. for families in transition. Since the early 90's this "home" for many who were homeless -- provided a quiet, safe place that they could regain some peace of mind and hope as they made new goals for their family's future.

Through the years we have continued our efforts to share this ministry as a support to programs who specializes in helping homeless families and those falling on hard times. We worked with PACT, HCAP, and the Dept. of Social Services who helped guide the families and provided resources to be better equipped to handle finances, parenthood, and being responsible for the choices they make. At the beginning of this program it was believed the founders hope was to provide single moms with children a safe place; to get them off the streets; so they could focus on rebuilding their lives. This initial goal still hold's true today. Your faithful commitment to support this ministry has provided many families with just that chance.

Under the capable and caring leadership of Ruth Uyechi, we shared compassion and comfort and learned how to offered grace even in the most challenging of times. Even after the loss of her leadership – those remaining to serve (Dot Suzuki, Hazel Masuda, Pamela Morikawa, Lowell Terada, Jennie Lee, and Kammy Grable), continue to do the same because that is what they think Jesus would want done. Because we see how showing someone the love of Jesus can change their lives, on your behalf, we provide shelter, support, and an invitation into the family of God. We hope that they will make the best of this opportunity and we pray that no matter where they go, they will leave here with some hope and great memories and an assurance that God loves them.

As we prepare our unit for a new guest family, we invite you to join us on Thursday, February 2 from 9 to 12 for a chance to put a sparkle on the apt. that will lift the spirits of our new guests. This will also be a chance when you can see the unit while it's empty of guests.


