In the Interim

This will be my last article for *Waves of Faith*. I will have shared your journey of faith for 19 months, and my ministry and faith have been enriched. I am glad that the congregation extended the contract so that we could share the journey through Holy Week. My last Sunday in worship will be April 23. The Chuukese Congregation will join us for that celebration.

Palm Sunday will be another celebration with palms. Once more we will invite those who are willing to join us outside the sanctuary (weather permitting) and then enter with a familiar Palm Sunday hymn and the waving of Palms. I am convinced, by my reading of the Gospels, that Jesus entered offering a different kind of rule. Instead the Imperial Procession of the Roman Governor accompanied by military troops, Jesus chose to enter on a humble donkey. Instead of the fear-filled welcome of the Roman Governor and his army, the procession was a celebration that God's kingdom was breaking into the world and bringing hope for the poor and the oppressed.

The Maundy Thursday Service will be similar and a bit different this year. We will begin with a simple meal in the sanctuary at 6:00 p.m. We will share that meal with Family Promise families who care to join us for the supper. Of course they will be welcome to stay for the rest of the service. In addition, Windward UCC will join us for the meal and the service as they did last year. The service will use Psalm 23 to relate to the last week of Jesus' life. We will celebrate holy communion as a part of that service.

CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Easter will begin for the early risers and hikers with a hike to the Makapu'u Lighthouse in time for the sunrise. Dan Jessee is checking on the projected time for the sunrise, and that will be announced. Breakfast will be from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. in rooms 3 and 4. The Festival of the Resurrection will be at 10:00 a.m. While every Sunday is a "Little Easter," Easter Sunday is always special.

On a totally different note, the Hawa'i Conference United Church of Christ will enter into an interim period in its ministry beginning June 4. The Rev. Dr. Charles Buck has resigned and will be moving to Northern California so that his wife can accept a job offer that will advance her career. In addition, the Rev. Sarah Rentzel Jones, Associate Conference Minister, has resigned effective June 1 to accept a call to become the Chaplain at Wilcox Hospital on Kaua'i. She has worked with the Tri-Isle Association and done a lot of work with youth ministry for the Conference. This is a time of change filled with opportunity.

The interim will give churches, Associations and the Conference time to reflect on the assessment of the ministry of the Conference completed in January. Associations can meet and discuss that assessment as well as begin a process of discerning what God is calling the church (local churches, Associations and Conference) to be and do as it moves into the future. This is a crucial time for KCC to be informed, to participate in those deliberations and to reconnect with fellow congregations. Now is the time to shape the ministry of the church in Hawai'i.

I will continue to hold this church and all of you in my prayers as you search for both a faithful direction for KCC and the appropriate pastoral leader. That is a challenging task, and you have an excellent Pastoral Search Committee that will continue to keep you updated as it finds and presents a candidate to the Council and then the Congregation. Remember two things. First, discernment belongs to the whole congregation, and, second, we make the best and most faithful decisions when we all bring our gifts to that process.


May God continue to bless you in your ministry.




Joint Worship & Potluck April 23
