Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. These words are a reminder of how we should strive to be in life, and especially in the Body of Christ at KCC. As many of you are aware, there exists a split in our congregation relating to different views of KCC and what its vision should be. People have different theological views on the Bible and its teachings. There are different views on what we should be looking at for in a new pastor. There are different views on how we conduct church and the role of a pastor.

I bring this difficult subject up not ask you to take my side or any other one's for that matter, but rather to inform you that your Council is considering several options to address this situation. I mentioned in the March newsletter that Council would be receiving a list of interim candidates with mediator skills from the Hawaii conference. However, there are no local candidates available at this time. There may be some on the mainland, but we need to first submit a job description with the Hawaii conference. Council will be reviewing and submitting this job description in the coming weeks. Council has also decided to consider looking into contracting with a local mediator to assist us with our differences. We are also considering a local

pastor that currently has his own church, who might be willing to help and has experience in mediation. This local pastor has an associate that is a lawyer who has done mediation for the courts who also has a masters degree in marriage and family therapy and in addition is an facilitator with the Bible Institute of Hawaii. Council will also be considering a mainland pastor that visited KCC last year with his family who was interested in applying for the interim position once he updated his resume and submits it to the Hawaii Conference.

As you can see, there is quite a bit going on with respect to moving forward with the goal of finding a permanent pastor.

During this time we encourage you to keep your Council members in your prayers as you continue to pray for God's leading of KCC's future. We value your place in this family of God and hope you will make yourself available as we make some challenging choices -- together.

As Luke 1:37 states, "*For nothing is impossible with God.*"

DEACONS MESSAGE

At the last deacons meeting we joyfully welcomed Vernon Pang. As we now

have four deacons, a fourth undershepherd group was created and a list of the four groups is posted on the bulletin board in the hallway. At the meeting we also held discussions regarding the benevolence fund, communion, prayers and visitations, the movie matinee held in March, and shared concerns regarding the hiring of both the interim and the settled pastor.

Some questions/concerns that were brought up were: What should be our next step if no local interim pastor is available? Where are we in the process of searching for both an interim and a settled pastor? Is it possible and would it be acceptable to hire an interim pastor of another denomination? We need someone with mediation skills who is able to provide pastoral care and preach on Sundays. It's been a year since Pastor Jack left, time is of the essence.

We encourage you to please share your thoughts with the council members so they are made aware of your concerns.

We also want to remind you to contact your deacon if you have any prayer requests or concerns. There is no doubt that prayer is a powerful thing indeed, and we wish to share with you the following devotion about prayer written by Greg Laurie:

"Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere." —Ephesians 6:18

I heard the story of three ministers debating the best posture for prayer.

One minister shared that he felt that the key was in the hands. He always held his hands together and pointed them upward as a symbolic form of worship.

Another minister suggested that real prayer was conducted on one's knees. That was the only way to really pray. The third said that they were both wrong. The only position in which to pray was to lie on the floor, flat on your face.

As they were talking, a telephone repairman had been working in the background, listening. Finally, he couldn't take it any longer. He blurted out, "For me, the most powerful prayer I ever prayed was while I was dangling upside down by my heels from a power pole, 40 feet above the ground!"

Listen: the posture of prayer is not the most important thing.

The main thing is to pray!

- You can pray in any position, at anytime, anywhere.
- You can pray publically, privately, verbally, silently.
- You can be kneeling, standing, sitting, lying down, or even driving.
- You can pray with your eyes open or closed! (Ever make eye contact with someone while praying?)

Sometimes we think that perhaps the Lord will hear our prayers more readily if they are prayed in a church building. But that is not necessarily true.

- Daniel prayed in a lion's den.
- David prayed in a field.
- Peter prayed on and under the water.
- Jonah's prayer was heard from the belly of a whale!

It doesn't matter where you are . . . Just pray! Share this today:

The posture of prayer is not the most important thing. Just pray!
