Your Council met on May 16th and continued discussions regarding the search for an interim pastor. The hiring of a mediator to assist with our differences at KCC was found to be uneconomical as an estimated fee of \$25,000 was provided by one mediation professional. The local pastor that was mentioned in my article last month was unavailable to assist us at this time.

We did find out that Rev. David Hirano will be ending his interim ministry at Pearl City Community Church (PCCC) on June 30, 2018. Rev. David sent us a copy of his terms of call at PCCC to assist us in our search process. I had the pleasure of speaking with Rev. David on the phone recently and he agreed to meet with Council at some time in the future to gather information about KCC and where we are in the process. Rev. David is not necessarily reaching out to apply for an interim position, but he wants to possibly assist us. As many of you are aware, Rev. David's wife, Sandra, was our bookkeeper for a number of years before they relocated to the mainland to be near their children. So, there is a tie to KCC. They also lived in Maunawili so are very familiar with the area. We will keep you posted on the progress with this possibility or other opportunities that presents itself to us.

Council also discussed the need to gather information from our members about their concerns, hopes and dreams for KCC. We decided to work on putting together an updated survey utilizing various surveys used in the past as well as adding new questions pertinent to where we are now. We are also considering having small group gatherings to determine what our members are looking for in KCC's future.

God continues to be at work at KCC. We are blessed to continue to have terrific speakers each Sunday. This time without a settled pastor continues to provide us an opportunity for growth in our own faith journey as we hear the spoken word from many different people called to serve God. Please continue to have faith and pray for KCC and your leaders as we move forward together.

On Saturday morning, May 26, Na Anela offered a great opportunity for all who were interested in learning more about CPR and the use of AED machines (Automated External Defibrillators). The gracious and very capable facilitator was Ms. Pamela Foster, President and CEO of AED Institute of America, Inc. I personally was very impressed and appreciative of Pam as she provided this class as a community service presentation. The company's mission is to promote within the community, the science and education of early defibrillators and CPR. They are a local distributor of AEDs and AED accessories. They are an American Heart Associaition and American Safety & Health Institute training center. I believe everyone who attended the free class would attest that they do training very well.

Pam educated us and made everyone feel more confident that they had the potential to help someone's life be saved by their willingness to assist and be prepared. She provided us the knowhow to operate the AED and explained how we could operate the machine with confidence and give someone a fighting chance to stay alive until help arrived.

Although this machine is about a \$1800 investment, we hope someday we will be able to purchase this so we can have it on property in case of an emergency. For now it stays on the wishlist at KCC.

NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS



Although our Missions Ministries are not committing to any new ministries at this time, we want to inform you of a new program for our Windward houseless neighbors. This in part was developed with the help of the Windward Coalition of Churches.

The Windward YMCA, several Kailua churches along church row and Hawaiian organizations have partnered with the IHS to sponsor the Kailua Service Caring events. Service events feature hot meals and showers, clothing, health screenings, medical benefits, access to addiction counseling, legal services, employment training/opportunities, housing support, veterans services, bus passes, and more.

Community volunteers, IHS outreach staff and other service providers gather the last Tuesday of each month from 10a.m. to noon at Daybreak Church 1230 Kailua Rd., to provide a hot meal, an accepting group of community members and a safe and dignified place for our houseless to seek assistance and community connections. In addition, houseless neighbors can sign up to volunteer at a community garden at Ulupo Heiau and harvest vegetables/food they have helped care for.
