MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

Aloha fellow members and friends of KCC! I have great news to share with you. At our August Council meeting, your leaders interviewed a candidate for the interim pastor position. The interview lasted for over an hour and half with good dialogue regarding his past experiences and studies in interim ministry.

It is with great pleasure that I inform you that your Council unanimously voted to recommend Pastor Chris Eng as our interim minister. We will be having a congregational meeting after worship on Sunday, September 16th to vote on hiring Pastor Chris as our interim minister. Many of you are familiar with Pastor Chris as he has graciously provided pulpit supply on several occasions over the last two years.

The interim pastor will be assisting us in bringing our church together. He will also be looked at to assist us in deriving a vision statement that we can adopt to represent our beloved KCC. He will also be looking at having meetings with as many members as possible to understand what they each consider important at KCC. Council decided that this will be a part-time position based on our finances and it also happens to be what Pastor Chris is able to commit to.

Pastor Chris was educated at UH Manoa where he earned a BA and a MA degree. He went on

to Fuller Theological seminary where he received his Masters of Divinity and further studied at San Francisco Theological Seminary where he received his Doctorate of Ministry. Pastor Chris has served in several churches over his career. He retired from Waiokeola Congregation Church in 2015 where he served as senior pastor for 10 years. Prior to that, he was the full-time pastor at Waipahu United Church of Christ where he served from 1985 to 2005. Pastor Chris also is certified in interim ministry as he completed a 60 hour course with the Hawaii Conference. Pastor Chris works as an on-call chaplain for Hospice Hawaii.

Please mark your calendars and plan to attend and participate in this important congregational meeting. This is a beginning step as we move forward with our process of finding a permanent full-time pastor to lead KCC in the future. Please continue to pray for KCC and your leaders as we continue on our journey!

DEACONS MESSAGE

Loss of a Loved One

As I grow older I'm starting to realize what a short time

we have here on earth. It seems like I have been attending quite a bit of funereal services lately of friends and relatives including people from our own KCC ohana. I often ask myself how we can find comfort and peace when we have lost a loved one through death. In doing some research here is what I found and would like to share with you.

If you have lost a loved one through death, you know that it is a painful experience. Jesus understood the pain of losing someone close to His heart. In the Book of John (11:1-44), we learn that Jesus lost a loved one named Lazarus. Jesus was deeply moved and wept at the loss of His friend. This story, however, doesn't end in tears. Jesus knew He possessed the power needed to raise Lazarus from the dead. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" (John 11:25). Jesus overcame death through His resurrection. It is comforting to know that death is not the end for those who believe. Those who know Jesus as Savior will have eternal life (John 10:28). God has prepared a new home for us where there will be no more death, tears or pain (Revelation 21:1-4).

Even if we are assured that our loved one is in a better place, we still experience the pain of their absence on earth. It is okay to grieve the loss of your loved one. Jesus wept over the death of Lazarus, even knowing He would bring Lazarus back to life. God is not afraid of our emotions or our questions. We can pour out our burdens on Him and trust in His love to provide us reassurance and comfort (1 Peter 5:7). We can remember the many good things about our lost loved ones and rejoice in the fact that we were able to share in their lives. We can share stories about the impact our lost loved ones have had on our lives. We might find it comforting to do some of the things our lost loved ones particularly en-



joyed or to spend time reminiscing about our lost loved ones with other close relatives and friends. We can also honor their memory by living our lives in a way that brings honor and glory to God.

It is important to remember that God is ultimately the source of our comfort (2 Corinthians 7:6). While it is good to remember our lost loved ones and to honor their influence in our lives, the Bible is clear that we are not to pray to lost loved ones or worship them in any way. Instead, we bring our prayers to God and ask Him for comfort and healing. The Bible tells us that God is the father of mercies and that He will comfort us in all our tribulations (2 Corinthians 1:3-4). Be assured that God loves you and that He understands how much you are hurting. Run to the shelter of the Most High where you will find sweet rest (Psalm 91:1-2).

In past years, we have collected our offering the Chuukese way and we will continue to do so. The 4C's explained that giving should be joyous, supported by the happiness of song and dance in a circle. Often seven circles are completed matching the seven days of the week. This method is used to encourage "a joyful giver." They did however remark that it is not disrespectful for people to not participate in the "circle" or if they chose to remain seated after one round; or just choose to "dance." It is noted that all cash donations will be equally shared between the 4C's and KCC.
