MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. 1 Peter 3:8-9

Aloha fellow members and friends of KCC! I have great news to share with you.

Yes, I realize these are the exact two sentences used in September's moderator notes. It is worth repeating as we now have an interim pastor. On Sunday, September 16, a congregational meeting was held to approve a recommendation from Council to hire Pastor Chris Eng as KCC's interim pastor on a part-time basis. 35 members came to the meeting and quorum was established (20% of membership which equated to needing 30 members present). A motion was made, seconded and the vote was taken after asking if there was anyone requesting discussion. The motion passed with 34 voting yes and 1 voting no. I want to thank all the members that were able to come to the meeting and vote. I would also like to thank all members and friends for your patience with your leaders. We, leaders, members and friends, have all been patiently and prayerfully waiting for God to provide us a pastor to guide us through this interim period at KCC. Pastor Chris is looking forward to serving the Lord with us.

There remains one step left to complete the hiring process of Pastor Chris Eng. The trustees are currently developing a contract for Pastor

Chris. They will be working together with him to finalize an agreeable contract. Please continue to pray for this work to be completed in the coming weeks. The hope is to have Pastor Chris start working at KCC in November.

As we enter the last quarter of 2018, it is time to start planning for 2019. Council and the church leaders are currently working on the budget for 2019. Please see any one of the church leaders if you have any budget requests to make or concerns to share about our budget. We will be having an informational meeting in November with a congregational meeting to follow sometime in December to vote on accepting the 2019 budget. We will pass on the dates for these meetings once they are finalized.

Please prayerfully consider your monetary pledges as well as pledges of your time and talent as we plan for 2019. Council will also be establishing a Nominating Committee in Oct. Please prayerfully consider how God wants to use you to serve him and his purposes for KCC in 2019. Is there a leadership role that you feel called to? Please speak to one of your leaders at KCC and they will be glad to discuss this with you. The congregational meeting in December will also be the meeting where we vote in new officers and leaders for 2019.

I am very thankful to all of the pastors that have shared their God inspired messages with us. Recently, Pastor James Kwong provided an inspiring and informative sermon about the type of community we should be in response to scripture from Philippians 2:1-18. Likeminded was presented as a way churches should

be...working together and serving one another...what family ought to be. He mentioned having a culture of humility and offering the best for each other. There was so much to learn including leader meetings being more about the Word than just business, thinking of all children as needing to be trained to be future leaders of our church, protecting the body of the church, how members need to reach out and advocate for the pastor, and much more. I encourage you to listen to a copy of his sermon that was recorded on a cd. Pastor James provided ideas to ponder as we move forward.

Please let me or any church leader know if you wish to serve on a hospitality committee to take care of refreshments after church. This would include both setting up and cleaning up. Council may consider reducing the refreshments to one Sunday a month as our human resources are limited for this important and enjoyable ministry.

As you can see, we have an exciting time ahead of us. There is much work that needs to be done as we move forward with the guidance and leadership of Pastor Chris Eng.

Among the many insights was administration of the benevolence fund.

The purpose of the benevolence fund is:

- 1. To assist with the financial needs of those who are unable to provide for themselves, and
- 2. To provide resources for ministries that give support and care to individuals or families.

The fund has grown over the years with your generous donations and has enabled many through very difficult times. You may have noticed that there hasn't been a collection for the benevolence fund in a while, and perhaps were wondering why. The benevolence fund currently has a healthy balance, thanks to a generous congregation. When the need arises in the future to replenish the fund then at that time a collection will be held

Requests for assistance have significantly declined. This may be a blessing. So far this year there have been only 2 requests for assistance, both asking for help with rent. Not surprising, since according to the Star Advertiser on 9/19/18, the latest census data indicated that Hawaii has the highest median monthly housing cost for renters in the nation.



FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE

Come 2019, Family Promise of Hawaii reports a critical need for additional partners to fulfill its mission of helping families to transition from homelessness into sustainable independence and permanent housing. The Family Promise concept is to rotate families from partner to partner on a weekly basis to help shelter the families in their emergency shelter program. Though as it stands, there are several gaps in the rotation schedule for the 3-4 families to have shelter as there are not enough churches able to assist as sites to provide overnight shelter and sleeping accommodations for these homeless families. Host congregations like ourselves, provide the physical space to sleep and meals to the families enrolled in their emergency shelter. Families arrive around 5:30 p.m. and depart in the morning around 7 p.m. Please keep this ministry in your prayers and if you have friends at other churches, invite them to consider adopting this helpful ministry outreach at their church and have them contact
