"Waiting for the Perfect Wave"

At the beach, swimmers and surfers wait for the perfect wave. Sitting in the sanctuary

of Kailua Christian Church, I notice what seems to be the waves of the ocean. The name of the monthly church newsletter provides a sense of how our faith moves along. And for some, whether in the Pacific Ocean or upon entering the church's sanctuary, the following feelings may ring true: "I'm tired of waiting. There's a sense of anxiousness I feel for things to begin happening. Time sometimes seems to stand still. And what's holding things up?"

In this season of Lent, these questions could relate to the time between Palm and Passion Sunday, April 14, 2019 and Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019. Jesus is hailed as King during the Palm Sunday processional but then his passion or suffering begins. There is the Last Supper, the Betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane and then Jesus' Trial and Crucifixion on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We can hardly wait for Easter Sunday to proclaim, "Jesus has risen from the dead! Hallelujah to the Risen Christ!"

For Kailua Christian Church UCC, these same questions emerge as the interim period is prolonged. We're still waiting for a New Vision Statement. And many wonder when the New Pastoral Search Committee will be formed so they can get to work. With many profiles of prospective pastors to review, how long is this

going to take? The "light at the end of the tunnel" seems to be so far away!

Here's my take on this:

"Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

(Hebrews 11:1) Yes, we have many hopes and dreams for our church. This needs to be paired with conviction that one day, what we prayed for will come to fruition. In the Easter narrative from John 20: 1 – 18, it is Mary Magdalene's witness to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord" that highlights the message of Easter. And for congregants of our church, there will come a time when each will say, "I have seen the newly called and installed pastor of Kailua Christian Church!"

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7

First of all, thank you to all members who attended our congregational meeting on Sunday, March 10th. We were able to establish quorum at this rescheduled meeting where we unanimously accepted the 2018 Annual Report.

Secondly, two leadership meetings were held in March as was previously mentioned in last month's Moderator's Notes. One was held on Sunday, March 17th, from 12pm to 3pm and the second on Tuesday, March 19th, from 7pm to 10:30pm. I am thankful to our leaders for taking time from their busy schedules to spend over 6 hours together to pray, fellowship with one another, and work collaboratively on KCC matters. Agenda items included an overview of our governing documents (i.e., charter of incorporation and bylaws), a presentation by trustee Dennis Fong on Venn diagrams, discussion of our approach to developing a vision for congregational vote, and the development of a vision statement that we felt best represented KCC.

Prior to these two meetings, the leaders were tasked with creating a list of three things that he/she felt was important to them at KCC. The deacons and trustees went a step further and prepared their renditions of a vision statement and brought it to our meeting. Dennis facilitated the discussion of the vision statement after teaching us about Venn diagrams and how they might be useful in our discussions. During our meetings, we decided the best approach to guide our congregation was for the leaders to develop a vision statement for KCC and present it to our congregation. Should anyone have any comments or concerns regarding the vision below, we ask that they submit them in writing to the email them office or to kccucc@hawaiiantel.net by April 15th. We will review these at our next Council meeting in April and determine target dates towards formally presenting the vision statement for acceptance at a congregational meeting. We will also be looking at next steps toward our goal of hiring a permanent pastor.

After much discussion, below is the proposed KCC vision statement that your KCC leaders unanimously agreed upon:

KCC Purpose Statement and Vision

We are a **WARM** church. We **Reach** out to people, bringing them to Jesus Christ through the Bible inspired by the Holy Spirit. We prepare others for **M**inistry and **A**ctive discipleship, in order to **W**orship and glorify God.

You will notice that it reflects something very familiar to us all. It contains part of our purpose statement that has been in our Sunday bulletin dating back to 1999 when the original purpose statement was adopted. It was amazing to be a part of your leadership team that came together to develop this vision statement.

I believe that God is guiding us to call a permanent pastor to KCC. This vision process is another step in His plan for us. Please continue to pray for your leaders, KCC and all of us as we continue to move forward together.

TRUSTEES REPORT

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 New International Version (NIV)

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

Your gracious and generous gifts of time, talent and resources continue to honor our God and bless everyone. A generous donation of office furniture was received from Wes Kanetake from his late brother's law office. An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was purchased and installed. Training on use of the device was scheduled for March 30. Actions to replace the deteriorated Assisted Listening System (ALS) in the sanctuary are moving ahead. Estimates for two replacement systems have been received. Actions to check adequacy of a proposed system being used in another church are in progress. Estimates to repair spalling areas on the concrete stairs were surprisingly expensive!! However, prayers were answered when a professional structural engineer (Gary Yamamoto) being approached by his sister-in-law, Susan Morita, shared our needs and Gary donated his time and talents and conducted a cursory visual structural inspection of the church complex. He considered structures to be sound, with no signs of major structural inadequacies and that the superficial cracks and spalls were non-structural and can be readily fixed. In addition, he most graciously and generously donated materials and his precious time to repair the spalling and hairline cracks!!! A big mahalo goes out to Gary.

Trustee, Dennis Fong initiated monthly meetings with the Chuukese Congregational Church of Christ (aka 4Cs) to sustain relationships and review the adequacy of our mutual stewardship agreement which has been automatically re-

newed each year since 2012. A proposal from the 4C church to provide outdoor lawn care services was presented to the Council for approval but was declined due to lack of capacity of our church to consistently provide the guidance and oversight needed to ensure safety and quality of services. A request from the 4C church to use facilities to conduct periodic recurring meetings of a women's group on Fridays starting in April was also presented to the Council but was not approved. A special request was approved for them to use the facilities on Fri. March 15. The 4C church increased donations from 2018 for January and February 2019.

We continue to need your help to be good stewards of all that God has blessed us with. A great opportunity would be to participate in the workday to clean, organize and maintain our facilities. This workday is scheduled for Saturday, April 6, 2019. Hope to see you there between 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Lunch will be provided.
