“Experiences with Pastoral Search Committees”

The search for a new called pastor for Kailua Christian Church UCC begins as a new Pastoral Search Committee is selected. Finding that right balance of individuals that truly reflect the diversity and unity of the church can be a challenge. Sometimes, an individual will volunteer to serve. Often, the leadership of the church extends an invitation to a member to be part of this important committee.

The work that will need to be done seems daunting at first. Members of the committee will need to digest the materials that will help move the church along. It is helpful if there is someone who has gone through the process and can share their knowledge and experience. Don't be afraid to ask questions. And be as open as you can when communicating your thoughts as well as your feelings.

The church's profile will need to be updated to correctly reflect the status of the current membership. Prospective candidates carefully review this document with interest in what the pastoral package includes (salary, housing, and benefits) and some churches withhold the actual figures until meeting with the pastor. Good stewardship plays an important role in establishing what the church can offer or what it can afford to remunerate the candidate. Honesty is important in sharing the church's financial assets and liabilities.

The support of the Hawaii Conference UCC

comes with a staff person (usually the Associate Conference Minister for the Oahu Association) who works with the chairperson of the committee and may visit the church on a particular Sunday. Members of the committee will want to meet this person who is usually a UCC ordained minister. Whenever there are questions or concerns, do not hesitate to call this person.

As I look back on my personal experiences with pastoral search committees, transparency is vital. Church members will seek out particular members of the search committee so everyone needs to be on the same page as how the search process unfolds. It is critical to begin and end each meeting with prayer. There should be that sense that “we are the church.”

As a pastoral candidate, I always strove to speak to each member of the search committee and to get to know them in some way. I ended up being called to 5 different churches in Los Angeles, CA, Seattle, WA, Honolulu, HI (2 congregations) and Waipahu. But I also know the disappointment of not being selected by a church I thought that God was calling me to serve as a minister. I've learned to allow the Holy Spirit to guide me as it guides the Pastoral Search Committee members as well.

As the Intentional Interim Pastor of KCC, I will continue to work with the leadership of this church as well as with this committee. It is an exciting time for the church, full of hope and promise for a bright tomorrow!

Council will be discussing these candidates and deliberating on who will fill the 4 open positions (4 members from Council have been able to commit to be a part of this committee, resulting in the need for 4 at-large). We will announce the members of the pastoral search

committee in the coming weeks, if not days. Please pray for your Council as they go through this selection process.

Remember that God always provides. It is also important to remember that He provides to us in His time. Have a blessed 4th of July and month of July!

**DEACONS MESSAGE****Amazing Grace**

"Amazing Grace" is one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world. We have sung it in church and at funeral services countless of times. With the message that forgiveness and redemption are possible regardless of sins committed and that the soul can be delivered from despair through the mercy of God, English poet and clergyman John Newton wrote the words from personal experience circa 1779.

Grace in Christianity is the free and unmerited favor of God as manifested in the salvation of sinners and the bestowing of blessings. Common Christian teaching is that grace is unmerited mercy (favor) that God gave to humanity by sending his Son, Jesus Christ, to die on a cross, thus securing man's eternal salvation from sin. Ephesians 2:4-9: "But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God..."

When this concept is truly grasped, service to Almighty God will flow with a freshness and

zeal that invigorates the soul. The failure to fathom the true significance of grace is the reason many church members are spiritually lethargic and unfulfilled.

Live with grace as often as you can, as much as you can, for as much of the glory of God as you can, because that's what the gospel is. It is the unearned, unmerited favor of God at Christ's expense. It's what He gives us that we do not deserve. That's why grace is so amazing.

Now we've all experienced it: that certain difficult, cranky, hard-to-get-along-with person who knows exactly how to push your buttons. Do we have to give grace to these kinds of people? You already know the answer ... and the truth is, these are the people who need grace extended to them the most.

Maybe you say, "But they don't deserve it!" Exactly. That's why it's called grace; it's unearned, unmerited, undeserved. And that's what makes it so beautiful. That's what attracted us to Jesus in the first place, and when we offer grace to people who don't "deserve" it, they will be drawn to Jesus too.

Sometimes it's hardest to give grace to the people who are closest to us (your significant other?). Maybe that's because we have higher expectations for them or we are so familiar to them that we just don't think about the importance of extending grace to them. Be aware of this!

When we obediently reach out to others with grace, God gives us the strength thru faith to follow through in giving great love. He knows that it's not natural for us to show grace to people (especially difficult people), but when we do so, it brings Him glory and joy because we're imitating Him. By being graceful and living with grace you put grace before emotions because grace is so much more important. It means gracefully letting go of things that only God can change. By having grace in your heart you are choosing to accept God's spiritual gift and adding more richness and blessings in your life.

Revelation 22:21 – "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen."

THOUGHTS OF A FORMER CLERK

I would like to share some of my ideas on church and personal statements of faith. I think it is important that we place these faith statements into categories. These categories can then help us identify which statements are foundational to our faith, and which statements are up for discussion.

Our Mission

Our personal and church mission statement defines why God created us and what our purpose is in life. I would define our mission statement with three key passages from the Bible.

The first is from Matthew 22: 37-39, which is Jesus's response to a question a Pharisee asks him "Teacher, which is the most important commandment".

You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind. This is first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: Love your neighbor as yourself

Unpacking Love from 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8 we have.

Love is patient and kind, Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. Love does not demand its own way. Love is not irritable, and it keeps no record of when it has been wronged. It is never glad about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.

The third scripture is from Matthew 28: 19-20, called the "Great Commission", is Jesus's last words to his disciples before he ascended up to heaven.

Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

I believe these three scriptures, summarizes God's mission and purpose for our lives. We are called to love God, love one another and to

take the good news of the Gospel to the ends of the world.

Our Vision

Our vision is what I believe God has placed into our hearts, as how to fulfill his purpose for our lives. This will be different from person to person and from church to church and is based upon the gifts and interests which God has given us.

I had a chicken skin moment when I read what the vision statement which the KCC church leadership team developed during their last retreat.

We are a WARM church. We Reach out to people, bringing them to Jesus Christ through the Bible inspired by the Holy Spirit. We prepare others for Ministry and Active discipleship, in order to Worship and glorify God.

I believe the concept of being a WARM church clearly defines Kailua Christian Church. I had the privilege of growing up with many of the children of the founders of Kailua Christian Church. Many years ago, as Colette and I left Hawaii to live on the mainland, I parted with one undeniable thought. That no matter what I did with my life after that. Whether I became a "success" in the world's eyes or crashed and burned as I have done many times, I could always return to KCC, be accepted and loved. Not judged or condemned but be warmly received. This is because the early members of KCC displayed to me, that my relationship with them was more important than anything else. This unconditional love relationship is what I believe lies is at the heart of our Christian Evangelical Church.

With most of the other religions of the world, men\women are presented with tasks, challenges or works which they must perform in order to attain "success". After which they are granted entrance into their "heaven" or in some cases become like a "god". Christianity on the other hand is about a broken relationship with our Creator God, which can only be repaired with

our faith in the redeeming power of the death and resurrection of his son Jesus Christ.

Our Foundation

I believe it is important that we have a set of beliefs which form the foundation of our faith. These statements of faith need to be seen as truth and are not arguable. Removing or replacing any one of these statements of faith would greatly alter and effectively render our faith ineffective. For a Protestant Evangelical Christian, I believe we need to start with the Bible.

I know that the Bible is a topic of controversy in our church. I would like to emphasize one important phrase when dealing with the Bible and that of “Bible Study”. I believe the Bible to be the living word of God. That being said, I don’t believe God gave us the Bible to be used as a weapon against one another. (With the enemy that is another thing!) I emphasize the term “Bible Study” because I believe the Bible needs to be studied as a whole and seen in context.

If there ever was a time in our country’s history when churches need to take a stand with a statement of truth, the time is today. In a period when our country has taken God out of our public schools and out of our public facilities, I believe people are hungering for truth.

- There is a Creator God who created us in his image with a desire to be in relationship with us. (Genesis 1)
- Thru sin (disobedience to God) we severed that relationship. (Romans 3:23 For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God)
- Jesus Christ born of a virgin mother (Mary) was crucified, raised on the third day and serves as the atonement for our sins. (Matthew 1:21 She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins)
- It is only thru faith in Jesus Christ can we be reconciled with God. (Ephesians 2:8 For by grace have you been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God)

- There is a third party the Holy Spirit who is our helper in all circumstances. (John 14:26 But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you)

Our Posture

Finally, I believe in order for us to move forward, we must have the correct posture. Luke 18:10-14.

¹⁰Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: ‘God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. ¹²I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.’

¹³“But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, ‘God, have mercy on me, a sinner.’

¹⁴“I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

If there are any two scriptures which I believe define the character of the early members of Kailua Christian Church is the scripture above, Luke 18:10-14 and 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 on Love.

- 14-day supply of non-perishable foods (with little to no cooking required)

- Cell phone and charger
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Portable radio (battery, hand crank or solar powered)
- Extra batteries
- Manual can and bottle opener
- Butane/propane stove or charcoal grill with fuel
- Ice chest and ice or frozen ice packs
- Matches and/or lighter
- Mosquito repellent
- Cash (small bills) or travelers checks
- Personal hygiene, sanitary supplies and diapers
- First aid kit and medicines (prescription or over the counter)
- Special needs supplies (eyeglasses, hearing aid, medical bracelet, etc)
