



**“New Bible Study Class Begins
Sunday, September 8, 2019
from 11:45 a.m. – 1:45 p.m.”**

The taste of bitter melon, chung choi and pressed noodles was incredible. We had gathered at the New Mui Kwai Chop Suey Restaurant on 132 Oneawa Street in Kailua after studying the first chapter of Mark’s Gospel at the church. As dishes were ordered and delicious fragrances drifted in our direction, we ate ‘family style’ although a few ate individual entrees and occasionally one or two would offer a bite of their lunch to any takers. I was game and tasted a variety of dishes that afternoon on Wednesday, July 17, 2019. Someone had paid for my initial order of oxtail soup which was carefully wrapped to go. Mahalo for treating me!

Studying God’s Word can be compared to arriving at your favorite restaurant so you can order what you know will be pleasing to your palate. Jesus said *“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled”* (Matthew 5:6). We often say that we hunger and thirst for God and that when we study the Bible, both our hunger and thirst are assuaged.

I led an inductive Bible study of the beginning of Mark’s Gospel before some of us ended up at that Chinese restaurant for lunch. There was such a wonderful sense of expectation that was matched with a high level of energy from those wanting to study God’s Word. We looked at concordances, dictionaries and commentaries that help us understand each book of the Bible, the Old Testament and the New. There was a discussion of the many

different translations of the Bible as well as what would be a “paraphrase” of Scripture. Some shared when they first began to study God’s word.

Because of this interest, a new Bible study class will begin on Sunday, September 8, 2019 in the church library. Bring whatever version of the Bible you have as we will be studying the Isaiah 40 : 1 – 31, N.R.S.V. An introduction to the inductive bible study method will be repeated for those who missed the 7.17.19 study. Questions asked will be answered. Invite those who also wish to learn about the Bible and how to study it.

This came about because the Sunday Tai-Chi class is ending and this Bible study will replace the same time slot. The Thursday Tai-Chi class that meets from 10:00 a.m. – 12 noon will continue. When we wish to make a change in our lives, there is always something in the time slot of what we hope to do. We must *“let go”* of whatever it is that is occupying that time and space and replace it with something new!

DEACONS MESSAGE**Finding the Sweet Spot in the Spirit by Living Your Life with Joy.**

In our August Waves of Faith Newsletter Paul Grable (KCC Deacon) wrote about the "The Fruit of the Holy Spirit". He summed up the nine attributes of living the Holy Spirit "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" per Galatians chapter 5:22-23.

Joy is experiencing the sweet spot of the Holy Spirit.

Webster's defines joy as "the emotion evoked by well-being, success, or good fortune or by the prospect of possessing what one desires." That definition leaves something lacking, however.

John Piper writes, "Christian joy is a good feeling in the soul, produced by the Holy Spirit, as he causes us to see the beauty of Christ in the word and in the world." Rick Warren adds his own definition: "Joy is the settled assurance that God is in control of all the details of my life, the quiet confidence that ultimately everything is going to be alright, and the determined choice to praise God in every situation."

Joy and happiness are wonderful feelings to experience, but are very different. Joy comes when you make peace with who you are, why you are

and how you are, whereas happiness tends to be externally triggered and is based on other people, things, places, thoughts and events.

One of the most important things in the Christian life is joy. However, it seems as if far too many believers are living without joy. To these believers it may seem as if they're just getting by or living a routine even though they know life is so much more.

The word joy appears over and over again in the Scriptures. Psalms are filled with references to joy. "Blessed are the people who know the joyful sound! They walk, O Lord, in the light of Your countenance."—Psalm 89:15

In his letter to the Philippians, the Apostle Paul speaks about joy and about the Christian's duty to rejoice over and over again. He writes, "Rejoice in the Lord always". This is one of those biblical imperatives, and it leaves no room for not rejoicing, for Paul says Christians are to rejoice always—not just sometimes, periodically, or occasionally, but always.

Our joy will not be perfect in this life; we will always strain and struggle. We will have our angsts and anxieties. We will have our ups and downs. Yet even in trying times we can experience the sweet taste of joy knowing that not only is indomitable joy coming when we enter the kingdom of God, but that we can experience the sweetness of joy here on earth now, especially in suffering. "Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory" (1 Peter 1:8).

For some people having joy in the midst of their trials seems like an impossibility. However, for a believer an onerous situation can always become tolerable when we fix our eyes on Christ and not our circumstances. Having joy in our troubled times is easier when we trust in God's sovereignty and His great love for us. We can endure all situations knowing that the Lord is sovereign, trusting in Him to accomplish His will in our lives.

The Lord gives us perpetual joy when we walk in obedience to him. Abiding in Christ entails various different things such as depending on His grace, abiding in His love, walking by faith, trusting Him, cherishing His Word, and being obedient to His Word. There is joy in obedience be-

cause of the great price that was paid for us on the cross.

So how well are we reading our facilities, our congregation, and ourselves for the changes and storms that are expected but have not yet arrived?

We will need your continuing help to ready our facilities as we search for a settled pastor. Thank you for supporting our workday on August 9th. A small but committed team deserves our appreciation for braving the hot humid weather to clean the sanctuary, classrooms 3 and 4, kitchen and the library for everyone else to enjoy. Barney generously repaired the spalling concrete on the window sills. Stephanie and Keith sacrificed their precious free Saturday to help. Vernon commanded a small pressure washer and removed a lot of accumulated dust and grime on windows, walls and stairs. Sharon dusted the classrooms and cleared decaying vegetation and fallen bird nests in the back. Nani, Hazel, Sharon, Jenny, Susan, Kammy and Dean scrubbed and cleaned. The focused two hour event in the morning appears to be more favorable than the previous all day event. One member from the Chuukese Congregational Church of Christ came by bus but arrived about noon after work was completed.

Save the date! The next workday is tentatively scheduled for 8:00 – 10:00 am Saturday, October 12, 2019. Focus will be on cleaning and organizing the Sanctuary front door and security screens, storage rooms on the first floor, bathroom screens, the Kitchen backside and the transitional housing.

But you do not need to wait until October. Together, each of us, just doing just a little each day with what you have, when you are able, will greatly help.

Cleaning and renovation of the library started. A vision of a library fostering Christian Education is getting clearer. Imagine our children and ourselves wanting to grow our understanding and faith, learning with each other in a clean air conditioned learning center equipped with a modern

electronic media learning center and visual displays. As we continue, we will need your help to clean, organize and reduce the number of books overflowing the bookshelves. We are inviting members to come by and see if you may be interested in giving a new home and a new life to a book.

Security. Continuing surprises prompting new locks and searching facilities after finding doors open or unlocked indicate complacency. We need your vigilant awareness and mindfulness to ensure safety and security for our premises and for each other. Security is everybody’s responsibility in a volunteer organization. See some thing say some thing do some thing before some thing gets to be some thing. Let’s not think it is somebody else’s job.... Really... Who did we hire 24/7?

A Local Church Profile is needed prior to recruiting candidates for the pastor position. The trustees are providing financial information to the Pastoral Search Committee to support completion of the profile.

A request from the Chuukese Congregational Church of Christ for approximately 70 persons to use the classrooms and grounds from 4:30 to 8:30 pm Friday 13 September and 1200 noon to 800 pm Saturday 14 September was discussed during the recent council meeting but was not approved.

Our hearts and prayers go out to Derrick our custodian who is working to recover from a decline in his health. In the interim we have contracted custodial services to Harvey Lee who provided custodial services in the past.

Bring a relative(s) or friend(s) to learn more about coping with DEPRESSION by changing one's attitude/thinking.


