Putting Back the Mojo at KCC Using PPP

The dictionary defines mojo as "magical charm." From what I can tell KCC had this mojo in the past and I am wondering what happened to it and how we can we get it back. Hopefully, the Deacons this year can be proactive and restore KCC to its glory days with feedback and help from our congregation.

As chairperson of the KCC Deacons I was thinking about using PPP. No, I'm not talking about the Federal government's PPP (Paycheck Protection Program). Our diligent Trustees are utilizing that PPP. The PPP I'm talking about is Planning, Participation, and Practice.

Planning

For planning to work we need input from all stake holders at our church. This includes our Pastor, Chairpersons of committees, and of course members and friends of our congregation. One item I would like to focus on this year is increasing our membership or at least increasing attendance to our services and events, especially among the younger demographic group. Our current active membership is about 126 people.

We currently have \$3,778.92 in our Deacons Fund. Last year we did not utilize most of this fund. This year I hope to see if we can use more this fund to help people in need per KCC's Policy Handbook.

Hopefully, we as deacons can be open minded and can think out of the box in trying to accomplish our short-term and long-term goals. KCC stake holders feel free to share your thoughts by texting or emailing the KCC deacons (Vernon Pang, Myra Yamada, Lily and Winchell Lee). I think the Deacons know already know how we will be handling Communion.

Participation

This will be a big challenge this year as was last year because the Corvid 19 pandemic. The deacons are currently grossly understaffed. My goal is to apply the 80-20 rule which is to identify inputs that are potentially the most productive and make them the priority. Here the deacons will rely on KCC stake holders again. Hopefully if we

follow this new procedure it will free up the KCC deacons time to plan events and/or working on other support issues that the Pastor may need. Because of the requirements instilled by the pandemic our usual visitation and prayer activities have really suffered. Can we meet the challenge by developing and applying new digital/electronic technology? Can we have members participate in prayers and visitations thru a mobile phone, tablet, laptop, or desktop computer using Zoom, Skype, or some other app? I know for myself what a blessing it is to communicate with my mom in her care home through the care giver's mobile phone or tablet.

Practice

Of the three P's, this one will probably be the most difficult to accomplish. Many times, we forget to be a little more loving, to be a little less judgmental, to be more forgiving, and to pray when we need help.
