Dear family and friends,

"I'll be back soon.", said HPD Officer BJ Miralles to his police brothers and sisters. Fresh hugs

with his wife and children, many heart-felt thank you for the doctors, nurses, family, friends, his police Ohana and God, he is on the road to a new life. As I listened to the deep gratitude of Officer BJ Miralles, I believe his words may very well have been inspired by Jesus Himself. Officer Miralles had contracted Covid-19 from a cluster at their Wahiawa police station. On Friday, February 19, after nearly 3 months of life-threatening lung restriction and other complications, he was finally, able to leave the hospital.

These weeks of Lent that take us to Easter, can be filled with overwhelming despair of what is wrong with ourselves and our world, what has been devastating loss, what is still very troubling about the unknown up ahead of us for as far as we can see from here.

This is all real and true. What is also true is the Hope that Jesus came to live, give and suffer for us to have and know. His life was not absent in any way from the cruelties of people, leaders, and life challenges. He grappled before His and our Heavenly Father for a different way, a way around or out of the worst of it. He knows what it is to struggle.

There, in part, comes our Hope for our day. Jesus knows despair, loneliness and pain; physically, emotionally and spiritually. He understands.

The other part of Hope from Jesus is beyond our ability, yet not beyond Him. As He lived through life, He came to the cross with the full weight of all that He had seen and known that had kept all from the freedom of life with the Father. Carrying our flaws, failures and sins to the tomb, it could have been over there.

The Hope we celebrate from Easter is that Christ rose from death to a new life among us. Our Hope is that from the darkest struggles, the profound emptiness of our lives, God can and is bringing new life. With His full forgiveness comes new beginnings for a fresh start in our lives. Like His disciples and closest friends waiting in their hidden places, or on the roads of discouragement, even out on the water with empty nets, Jesus comes in His time to us as well. He has His way to find us with healing, healthy changes and a call to be helpful with Him in our world.

What is true of Easter is meant to give us Hope on our journey today.

I am grateful to God, and to you to be with you. I am lifted and inspired by fresh touches of Hope in this new season of new beginnings together.
