MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

Aloha dear brothers and sisters in Christ. We are all very anxious to get back together at our KCC church building and grounds and that day is coming soon. In the interim, we are continuing to spruce up the facilities and prepare for a fresh start upon reopening. We hope to reopen in person, but also via Zoom so that people may continue to worship and participate with us remotely if that is preferable to them.

We have been having terrific guest speakers over the past several weeks while the Vallejo-Sandersons are grieving the loss of our beloved Beverly and planning her memorial services. We know that Pastor Dale has a lot to deal with and is overwhelmed by the loss of Bev and the transitions in their lives all while trying to help us with our new start. We are continuing to be patient and work cooperatively with each other as we all try to navigate this potential post pandemic time that we are in the midst of

We are no longer tentatively planning to formally reopen Kailua Christian Church (KCC) for in-person worship and other activities on June 27, 2021. We now plan to formally open to worship together in the KCC sanctuary about one month later on Sunday, July 25, 2021. The Council and the KCC Covid 19 Coordinators are working on appropriate protocols for the re-opening.

In the interim, we will be experimenting with broadcasting our Zoom service on Sunday mornings from the sanctuary at KCC and onto the big screen at the front of the church. The worship team and others may be involved in the broadcast and/or viewing efforts from the sanctuary. This is a work in progress.

We are also rescheduling the all-church vision and planning retreat to Saturday morning, July 10, 2021. With this schedule, we will have two weeks between our vision and planning get-together prior to our formal reopening. This should give us a little time in between to begin to implement the new vision and plans.

Our KCC workday, previously scheduled for Saturday, June 12, 2021, is being taken off of the

calendar for now. We will be encouraging small groups to take on projects around the church throughout the summer as a form of ministry and fellowship and service. We will be hearing more about this during our Zoom worship services.

Please mark your calendars accordingly. We will continue to provide you with updated information as it is developed.

The 2021 'Aha Pae' Aina is being conducted remotely this year via Zoom from June 13-19, 2021. This year the Council selected me to represent KCC at the 'Aha and I have been authorized to attend and vote on behalf of KCC for the matters of business that are discussed and presented on Saturday, June 19, 2021.

We continue to be hopeful for a great year of service to our Lord.

The application process is fairly simple:

- --Ask your deacon (Vernon Pang, Lily Lee, Winchell Lee or Myra Yamada) or the church office (Kammy Grable/808-261-0125) for the application form.
- --Complete all required information which will include a short paragraph explaining one's financial situation that is prompting you to apply.
- --Attach a copy of the bill and a pictured ID with the completed application and drop off the packet with Kammy. If mailing in application, send to:

- --Your application will be reviewed by two deacons and an interview will be set up in a timely manner.
- --Each applicant's interview is kept confidential and when request is approved, the billing company will be contacted by the deacons and a check (signed by two deacons) will be mailed directly to the company. Partial rent and utility bills are examples of past payments.

We look forward to helping individuals meet their financial needs!



TRUSTEES ARTICLE

Getting ready. The council is working toward a thoughtful and orderly schedule for reopening. The time has come to get our equipment and facilities ready as we return to worship God and celebrate each other in person. Susan, Dean and Vernon have been collaborating with contractors and identifying funds for needed major projects. The condition of the roof was surveyed and found good. No action is needed at this time to repair or replace the roof. The air conditioning system is obsolete and risks to continued operations are high. Replacement of the system is underway. A control processor is being rented to replace the failed one. Aaron is reviewing options to upgrade the existing lighting control system. There are many smaller projects which may be undertaken without contracting for services. Just look. Workdays have been semi-annual events attended by a few. Rather than a tiring and lengthy workday, trustees are encouraging volunteers who have the time, interest, and resources to independently identify and take on small maintenance projects like cleaning, organizing, and lubricating locks and repairing jalousie handles in the interim starting in June until we reopen in July (planned). Some more adventurous volunteers have expressed interest in pressure washing frequently used outdoor walkways, repainting the parking stall stripes and rejuvenating the bathrooms by removing rust, priming and repainting stalls and rejuvenating fixtures. Let us all be good shepherds of all these gifts God has bestowed upon us!
