MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

A lot of things are happening at KCC as we prepare to worship together again. The offices are being rehabilitated, new AC has been added, the bathrooms are being painted and upgraded, the parking lot has been restriped, the sidewalks have been power washed, the gate is being fixed, the flower beds are getting worked on, the yard is getting watered and maintained, the roof is going to get a new coating, the carpets have been shampooed, and the whole facility is getting cleaned and ready for our physical return to see each other and worship our God together in person.

Aaron Tanaka has been working hard to make our facility capable of broadcasting our worship via Zoom onto the big screen in the sanctuary and to the members and friends that want to continue to join us via Zoom even after we all get back together.

In addition to the Vallejo-Sandersons grieving the loss of Beverly, Pastor Dale's father passed away on Thursday, July 1, 2021. He had been hospitalized in Florida and Dale was able to go there for a short visit in June. Dale's stepmother, Annette is also hospitalized in Florida. Please pray for Dale and his family and all that are on their plates right now.

In the interim, we are continuing to have wonderful guest speakers to share the message for us and help us lead the worship service. Please continue to be patient and work cooperatively with each other as we all try to continue to do church as a team. We are still tentatively planning to formally reopen Kailua Christian Church (KCC) for in-person worship and other activities on July 25, 2021. The Council and the KCC Covid 19 Coordinators are revising appropriate protocols for the formal reopening.

We have also decided to take the all-church vision and planning retreat off the calendar for now. It had been scheduled to proceed on July 10, 2021. It will be rescheduled to sometime after we formally reopen, perhaps during the month of August.

We have just started broadcasting our Zoom service on Sunday mornings from the sanctuary and the office at KCC and onto the big screen at the front of the church. Those of you who can participate in worship via Zoom, we encourage you to continue to do so until we formally re-open again on July 25th. Those of you who have not been able to join us via Zoom, you are now welcomed to come to the sanctuary on Sunday mornings at 10:00 a.m. If you do come to the church to worship, here are a few things that we will ask of you upon arriving:

- Make sure you have your face coverings on upon entering the building and keep it on during and after the service.
- Enter through the main door to the sanctuary and stop at the check-in table.
- A church volunteer will provide you with a sign-in form at the entry door, so we have a record of attendees. Please fill it out and place it in the basket provided.
- An Offering box is located in the back of the sanctuary, and Offering plates will be at

the altar. Offering envelopes will be available at the table at the back of the sanctuary.

- You will be guided to chairs where seating will be 6 feet apart. Please follow social distancing seating and when you are up and greeting and visiting with each other before and after the service.
- Singing will be permitted but we are asking everyone to keep their facemask on while singing.
- If you develop a fever or begin to experience symptoms during worship, you should immediately return home.

We are continuing to encourage individuals or small groups to take on cleaning and watering and other projects around the church throughout the summer as a form of ministry and fellowship and service. If you are so inclined, contact Kammy or Susan Morita or Dennis Fong for appropriate work projects at the KCC facilities.

The 2021 'Aha Pae'aina was conducted remotely this year via Zoom from June 13-19, 2021. KCC was recognized as a 5 for 5 UCC church collecting offerings and donating to all five of the special UCC offerings throughout the year. Rev. Dale Vallejo -Sanderson was also specially recognized as our new pastor. The business meeting went very smoothly this year with no objections to the various matters of business that were discussed and presented on Saturday, June 19, 2021.

DEACON'S MESSAGE

Good and Faithful Servants

Jesus speaks to the seriousness of **acedia** (a lack of care) in the Parable of the Talents.

You know the story, right? A master divvies out talents to three servants: to the first, five; to the second, two; to the third, one. The first two do something with their talents, trading them and acquiring more. The one-talent guy, however, does nothing. He buries his talent and pulls up a chair until his master's return.

When the master finally returns from his extended trip, he asks the three to pony up. The five-talent guy presents his master with five more. The twotalent guy presents his master with two more. The master praises both as "good and faithful servants."

When **acedia** is full-grown, we no longer want ourselves or the world to change.

Indifference convinces us that change isn't possible. Left unchecked, it grows into a deep-rooted cynicism, the kind that gives the same response to personal transformation and societal injustice: "What for?"

Many church members remain uninvolved because (a) they have not understood they must be involved; (b) they assume they're not needed because others are serving; (c) they don't know how to get involved.

Indifference keeps us small and locked in selfpreservation mode. It forces us to settle for less than what we were created to be. It numbs our hearts and our capacity to feel. It's the little voice in us that says, "what's the use?" in the face of the difficulties in our lives and work or anything else that involves commitment, perseverance, pain, and failure (which is almost everything that gives life meaning).

No believer should be able to read the bible (God's word) and remain unwilling to serve God through a church.


Church membership is not a biblical command but rather a way to help manage today's local churches. Used well, church membership can offer many benefits for individuals and local churches to assist in spiritual growth. Church members should evaluate their life experiences, desires, skills, passions, and think of ways of how they can serve their church and God.

Romans 12:5 teaches, "we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." In other words, every believer in Christ is a member of the universal church. In addition, each believer is to be involved with a local community of believers to build up one another in the faith (Hebrews 10:25).


