It is a process I am learning more and more about in my own life. As I grow in being more open to Christ peace at work in the things that disturb me, creates anxiousness and fear, I am more able to come along others with more of a non-anxious presence in their challenges that Christ cares about.

My prayer for our Kailua Christian Ohana is that we may continue to grow in welcoming the peace of Christ as He promises. I pray that Christ's peace will mount up in our hearts in the face of these many uncertainties of the ongoing challenges of Covid, the concerns for our loved ones and our own wellbeing, and the state of difficulties many are facing in work, home life and our communities. Our world we live in is desperate for real peace.

Christ's peace begins in our hearts opened to Him and begins to flow forth as we humbly follow Christ's heart for all people.

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

Jimmy Carter wrote a book in 2005 which is entitled "Our Endangered Values, America's Moral Crisis" wherein he offers a passionate defense of the separation of church and state and warns that fundamentalists are deliberately blurring the lines between politics and religion. In the Introduction he writes about our country as follows:

With the most diverse and innovative population on earth, we have learned the value of providing our citizens with accurate information, treating dissenting voices and beliefs with respect, and accommodating free and open debate on controversial issues. Most of our political leaders have extolled state and local autonomy, attempted to control deficit spending, avoided foreign adventurism, minimized long-term peacekeeping commitments, preserved the separation of church and state, and protected civil liberties and personal privacy.

All of these historic commitments are now being challenged.

How prophetic.

He was once asked to express his definition of success in life in fifty words or less. This is his definition.

I believe that anyone can be successful in life, regardless of natural talent or the environment within which we live. This is not by measuring success by human competitiveness for wealth, possessions, influence and fame, but adhering to God's standards of truth, justice, humility, service, compassion, forgiveness and love.

Jimmy Carter goes on to explain that there he had observed a disturbing worldwide trend towards fundamentalism among political leaders and within major religious groups and they have become increasingly intertwined and prone to conflict. The three words that characterize this fundamentalism are: Rigidity, Dominance and

Exclusion. Again, these observations were and are very prophetic.

He says that "Those Christians who resist this inclination towards fundamentalism and who truly follow the nature, actions, and words of Jesus Christ should encompass people who are different from us with our care, generosity, forgiveness, compassion, and unselfish love."

Jimmy Carter is a wise and eloquent writer about how his Christian faith has shaped his moral vision. In my opinion, he is one of our finest human beings and a good example of a follower and servant of Jesus Christ. If you get the chance to read any of his books you will learn something and be inspired. I encourage you to do so.



I proceeded into the store as my curiosity got a hold of me. As I walked pass the book section, there was a large sign indicting RELIGION BOOKS, not a large section, approximately four shelves about 3 feet long. Most of the books were black, silver, and gray. One book stood out because of its color—light brown and orange. It kind of caught my eye: Daily Grace, devotional reflections to nourish your Soul, insights from many authors.

Rich Mullins was a beloved artist and songwriter in the world of Christian music, and before he was tragically killed in a jeep accident on September 19, 1997, he had written many beautiful praise songs that had t ouched the hearts of numerous people. Erick Hauck, a close friend of Rich, recalled being with him in a worship service just a few days before he died. Some friends just wanted to gather together and praise God, and everyone had brought instruments to play together. The music sounded awful--even the leaders were singing out of tune.

Rich later went up to the microphone and said, "I love to be in church. I love to listen to people sing and play from their heart. In my profession, we worry about being in tune and sounding good, but this music tonight is the most pleasing to God, because it is so real, and it comes from the hearts of the children of God." That was the last time Eric ever saw Rich Mullins cry.

Today Rich Mullins is worshipping God in Heaven, but while he was on the earth he loved to be in church and worship with his fellow Christians. One of his band members once said, "for Rich, even an hour in a bad church was better than not going at all."

God desires that His children be in fellowship with each other. We need other believers around us to encourage our faith—and to help us worship God with our whole hearts. Don't "give up meeting together" with other believers—it will bless you more than you can imagine.

Let us not give up meeting together,,,but let us encourage one another. Hebrews 10:25.


