Dear family and friends,

"Whenever the cloud was taken up from the tabernacle, the Israelites would set out on each stage of

their journey; 37 but if the cloud was not taken up, then they did not set out until the day that it was taken up. 38 For the cloud of the Lord was on the tabernacle by day, and fire was in the cloud by night, before the eyes of all the house of Israel at each stage of their journey." Exodus 40:36-38

In the late 80's, as the Kilauea volcano was flowing freely down the mountain side, Bev and I took my brother, Dave, on a hike to see close up as the red-hot lava burst into the ocean. The impact caused billowing white dense clouds to burst into the sky. With our three sons young Anthony 9, Andrew 6, and Alex 3, we hiked in over the rocks to get closer to the meeting of lave and ocean. Bev remained on a high point of older stable lava rock. We ended up being about 100 yards away from Bev when the dusk began to set in, and rain started to pour. We were heading back to Bey on the precarious sparse trail between jutting rocks. I was carrying Alex, when I looked up and saw Bev in the distance waving to us. Suddenly with a gust of wind, the dense sulfur laden white cloud swept up from the ocean right over us. It was so thick Bev disappeared. I couldn't even see the next step in front of me. We had to just stop and wait, hoping and praying the way would be open up to us soon. Soaked by the drenching rain, we moved forward as the wind opened a way through the cloud for a few steps, then we had to pause again as the cloud returned. Finally, we arrived at Bev, she embraced us and told us how strange it was to one minute see us and then suddenly we were completely

gone. We were living on a journey of moving as the way opened, and then waiting when as it closed

I think of the people of Israel as they were venturing into a new land, dependent on the cloud and fire of God to lead them. When it stopped, they stopped and when it moved, they moved. God was building into them a heart and willingness to wait on Him, to trust His guidance and timing. We thought of plowing ahead blindly into the unknown out there on the crust of the volcano, but we learned to wait for the right time, until the way was open to us.

We are living in a season of restraint and waiting in many ways, and it is not always easy or clear when and how to go forward. This season unlike any other in my memory has challenged and encouraged me, as I hear in many of you as well, to learn to rely in new ways on God's faithfulness even when the way seems cloudy at the moment.

We hope to be meeting again with person-to-person Sunday worship as the spread of Covid 19 reduces and we can responsibly support more personal gatherings together.

I want to invite you to join in, in new ways of serving here at Kailua Christian Church. To rise up from the limited way we have lived as a church by this season to help create a greater, more personal and inspiring gathering on Sundays when we do open.

It may be weeks yet; it may take a month or two. In the meantime, we would like to build teams to help Aaron with the zoom hosting, sound for in

the church, greeting with Covid protocol, and being present to see that all who come are welcomed to the love of Christ and the family of Kailua Christian in new ways.

Soon, you will be receiving invitations to be part of teams for a fresh new beginning of God's family here. You may think you can't help, aren't qualified or skilled enough. If you have the heart to serve and learn, we can all learn. We will be having training soon.

Let's pray for courage to rise up in fresh ways for the new opportunities together, that we each can be part of something new together.
