Dear family and friends,

"Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, magi

from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, ² "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him." Matthew 2:1-2

I think this first Sunday of Advent, November 28, could be one of the more remarkable fresh starts of our lives as we come together, with each other, for each other and for all who may come to be in celebration of Jesus Christ, our wonderful Lord, Savior, Forgiver, Counselor and giver of life

Soon you will be receiving more details for this special new beginnings for our Kailua family. I encourage you to know your presence is a gift to all of us, and God. There will be plenty ways in which you can be of tremendous help in welcoming each other and helping make this a great Advent celebration as a new time of being together. As new information will be coming soon, prepare your hearts in prayer and thanksgiving to find a way to participate.

Jesus's arrival wasn't fanciful by any means, but

it was wonderfully glorious by God's design and shared by all who found their way to Him then and over the years since then.

MODERATOR'S NOTES

On Sunday, September 17, 2021, Pastor Yumiko Nakagawa graciously filled in for Pastor Dale while he was in isolation from Covid 19. She shared that she has recently been hired at River of Life to help serve the people of Chinatown and she shared her observations from River of Life and Matthew 25. I believe that message is worth repeating in this Newsletter. The following are lightly edited excerpts from that sermon.

Matthew 25: 40 says: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Here in this passage, we see the secret of God's Kingdom. The people who belong to Christ inherit the Kingdom, and the Kingdom is fundamentally different from this world.

In world A, much like this world, the kingdom is built with power - whether it be military, financial or political. The rich and powerful, like us, receive special treatment. We are looked after, well fed, and clothed in nice clothes. Even Christians congregate around the power and are attracted to riches. Some of us may equate glorifying God's name with Christians gaining political power, social status, and cultural influence.

But that's not how Jesus inaugurated His Kingdom. Jesus didn't fight for a political agenda (independence of Israel from the Roman empire), and He didn't let people make Him a new religious leader. Jesus didn't conquer the world with the power.

Quite to the contrary. Jesus inaugurated His Kingdom by becoming powerless. Yes, Jesus on the earth used His power to heal the sick, to provide for the hungry and to welcome everyone. But, that's not all Jesus did. Jesus was not only the provider and protector for the sick, weak, and marginalized. Jesus was also someone who became weak, despised, naked, hungry, thirsty and crucified. Christ, the ruler of all, came to the world as a baby, vacating His seat of power in heaven. And He continued to walk with the weak until He reached the Cross, where He became nothing. Practically naked, nailed the cross, slowly dying, He became nothing. He became powerless and despised. And that's our King in the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom that we pray to see on this earth is ruled by a King who became hungry, thirsty, covered with blood, sweat, tears and dust. He became powerless. Jesus was covered with His own blood, and probably many other things, slowly became lifeless, and passed out at the end.

And Jesus invites us to do the same: to build the kingdom, not by increasing our influence, our power, or our voices, but instead, we build the Kingdom by serving the poor, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger and looking after the sick. When the world heads to power, the Kingdom way directs us to go in the opposite direction.

Jesus invites us to congregate ourselves around the ones the world is ignoring.

Wow. What a clear and direct message for us about the Kingdom of God and the type of King that Jesus is and the role that we should play in His Kingdom. Thank you, Pastor Yumiko.
