Dear family and friends,

It was during a time in my life as a pastor when it seemed we were heading for a ship-wreak. On all

fronts of relationships, finances, and misinformation, I felt most challenged, alone, and deeply discouraged. One morning I came upon these words of Paul found in Acts 27:22-24

"I urge you now to keep up your courage; not one of you will be lost, only the ship. ²³ For last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood by me ²⁴ and said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul...." Acts 27:22-24

These words came as if written specifically for me, and for the church, in this despairing time. The call to stay the course with courage in the face of the unknowns and to see to the well-being of the people through the difficulties, lifted me. I was brought to peace, courage and focus of my life vision when I remembered, "the God to whom I belong and whom I serve."

As we venture into 2022, I want to invite you to join me and our church council in listening to God's word, God's heart and God's call; 'to keep up your courage'.

In the ongoing rush of low and high tides of uncertainty with our pandemic, our economy, strains on personal relationships, and for many numerous health challenges, we have good reason to feel overwhelmed and discouraged.

Yet the God 'to whom we belong and whom we serve', is present, participating and keeping us afloat through it all. Not only are we

afloat to survive, we are called to dream from these assurances, to regain a focus of what matters most to God, to others and ourselves for His goodness of His Kingdom to be shared, felt and brought to life in new ways.

So, I invite you to pray, to reflect, to ask and listen to God for guidance of thought and heart for what God is calling us to be about in this next season, even in the midst of these unsettled times. I hear the words given to the prophet Habakkuk;

"Then the Lord answered me and said: Write down the vision; Make it plain upon tablets, so that the one who reads it may run."

Habakkuk 2:2

I encourage you, with heart and mind on the God to whom you belong and serve to dream, imagine, listen to God's stirring in your heart. Write it out. Talk it over with others. Above all, seek for what is good, worthy of praise and honoring of God's will for the salvation of all people and our part in this new season God is leading us through.

I invite you to share with me if you would like. Send what you have written to our Council leaders, and/or be prepared to share when we do have our All-Church Planning Retreat. The date for our planning retreat is pending when we can meet in person.

MODERATOR'S NOTES

The Institute for Human Services ("IHS") was founded by Father Claude DuTeil. When he first started, it was called the Peanut Butter Ministry. He reached out to the homeless people of Honolulu by providing them with food and care and other support. That ministry has grown and thrived and the number of people who need it have not diminished in recent years.

The State of Hawaii is now very involved as a partner in IHS and KCC's former Pastoral Associate, Connie Mitchell, has been the executive director there for many years.

Recently the IHS website contained the following quote from Father DuTeil from 1983:

"People need love and acceptance most when they are the most unlovable... These are very lonely people. Somebody has to step in and surround each of them with warmth, so that he or she can become a different kind of person..."

Some people have the idea that the chronically homeless people don't mind being homeless, or that they don't deserve to be housed because they are not doing enough to pull themselves out of their bad circumstances, or that they are where they are due to their bad choices or drug or alcohol use. The homeless person may even agree with these sentiments and say that they do not need to be helped and want to be left alone.

But God did not plan for His children to be left alone or for these dire circumstances for his children. He wants all of us to be in relationship with Him and each other. God has a better plan for them and for us. God doesn't only love us when we are loveable, He loves us when we are very unlovable. That is when we need it the most and that is when He can work to transform us into the people that He has planned for us to be.

My hope for 2022 is that KCC embarks on a mission ministry to the poorest of God's children, especially the homeless.

The KCC Missions Chairperson for 2022 is still an open position and the ministries that we had been performing for the poor and homeless in our community have not been functioning as they were before the pandemic. During 2020 and 2021 we have had to suspend our ministries with Family Promise and our dinners at River of Life. Our transition apartment has also remained empty. We need to recalibrate those ministries to do new things in 2022.

KCC is known to be a WARM church. These are desperate people with little or no hope. Let us use our warmth to surround our unworthy and unloved brothers and sisters with God's love and our care. If any of you feel called to lead our Missions Team in 2022, please let us know.

At the luncheon there was food, fellowship, and sharing of information about the deacon's duties and responsibilities. Since there hasn't been a Deacons luncheon for a couple of years, it seems appropriate to share this information now.

The responsibilities of the Deacons are to assist, along with the Pastor, with the spiritual health of members. They also assist with the preparation and administration of communion and administer the Deacon's Benevolence Fund. Interviewing candidates for church membership is

on the cover were printed for this purpose. The Deacons ask that when requesting for prayers the requestor state whether a card should be sent or not, and then later provide the full name and address of the recipient to a deacon. This would expedite cards being sent in a timely manner.

We wait for the time when we will be able to worship together in person. Till then we encourage our members and friends to keep in touch with one another and to not hesitate to contact any deacon if you have needs that we may be able to help with.

The 2022 HCUCC Church Leaders Event will be held on Saturday, February 26, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., via Zoom. The title of the event, "Oh God, What Now?", reflects what many of us have been asking—especially over the course of the ongoing pandemic. While we cannot guarantee that attendees will leave with the answers they want, we hope to create dialogue, entertain questions, and offer a sense of reassurance to get us through the meantime.

This Leaders Event will be unlike any other before. The Hawai'i Conference has traditionally held an annual Church Leaders Event in the spring to help orient newly elected church leaders to the functions of their positions. This year, the Leaders Event will take a different direction, focusing on conversations for leaders to connect with one another and be encouraged in their roles.

Our conversations will be built around two articles by Susan Beaumont:

1. Leading in an in-between season

"The usual tools of leadership aren't effective during times like the one the church finds itself in now -- those liminal seasons when the path forward isn't clear."

2. Innovating Into an Unknown Future

"Plans create an artificial sense of control, but they cannot resolve the deep disorientation of a liminal season—a season in which something has ended but a new thing is not yet ready to begin. In fact, the wrong plan will distract you from the innovation needed to thrive in the next chapter."

Rev. Susan Beaumont is a consultant, coach, author, and spiritual director who is known for her innovative work in leadership dynamics within large churches. "Susan is known for engaging the best of business practice, filtered through the lens of careful theological reflection. She moves easily between discernment and decision making, and nurtures the soul of the leader along with the soul of the institution."

Letter from HCUCC

January 26, 2022

Dear Partners in Ministry,

As you are aware, the Kingdom of Tonga is in the midst of "an unprecedented disaster" due to the eruption of Hunga Tonga – Hunga Ha'apai on January 15. There is damage from the ash and tsunami waves which severed the fiber optic cable servicing the nation. Reports indicate that the entire population of nearly 105,000 people are impacted with contaminated water as well as collapsed houses on the most devastated islands. Danny Tengan, HCUCC Disaster Ministries Coordinator, has secured water to ship to the stricken nation. The Conference Office is partnering with Lihue United Church's associate pastor Leni Namoa of the Tongan Language Ministry to collect an offering which will be directed to the hardest hit districts of Tonga and its 170 islands. We invite the congregations of the Hawai'i Conference United Church of Christ to stand in solidarity with the Tongan people by receiving an offering for Tonga Relief on January 30, February 6, or February 13. One hundred percent of the funds collected will be channeled through the Tongan Language Ministry for direct aid and help to those lives most distressed by the disaster. Churches may submit relief checks through the Conference Office, made payable to HCUCC with the notation "Tonga Relief." Also, churches and individuals may make donations online

through our Disaster Relief fund, by clicking the "Donate" button, then edit "Disaster Relief to read "Tonga Relief."

Our call, as followers of Christ, is to be the light on the hill. May our light shine bright in this time of support and love for those in Tonga.
