#### **MODERATOR'S NOTES**

The following are edited excerpts from Father Gregory Boyle's book called Tattoos on the Heart in the chapter called "Compassion". He is a Jesuit priest and the founder and executive director of Homeboy Industries, a gang intervention program in Los Angeles. I am inspired by him.

Sympathy is the feeling we have when we acknowledge that someone has suffered a loss.

Empathy is the feeling we have when we recognize and feel the same pain as someone who has suffered a loss because we suffered a similar loss.

Compassion is different. It is who God is. God is compassionate, loving kindness. It is not a fleeting emotion rising to the surface like sympathy, empathy, eros or anger. It is full throttled from the deepest parts of our being. If we long to be in the world who God is, then, our compassion must find a way to vastness. Jesus says that we should not only love those who love us, but to love the enemy and find some spaciousness for the victimizer as well as the victim. This resembles the more expansive compassion of God.

Compassion is how Jesus was moved, from the entirety of his being. He was "moved with pity" when he saw folks who seemed like "sheep without a shepherd." He had room for everybody in his compassion.

The "sinner" or "outcast" was a social grouping of people who felt wholly unacceptable. The world had deemed them disgraceful and shameful. Jesus' strategy for the outcast is a simple one: He ate with them. Eating with outcasts rendered them acceptable.

Compassion isn't just about feeling the pain of others; it's about bringing them toward yourself. If we love what God loves, then, in

compassion, margins get erased. "Be compassionate as God is compassionate," means the dismantling of barriers that exclude.

Compassion is not a relationship between the healer and the wounded. It is a covenant between equals.

Compassion is always, at its most authentic, about a shift from the cramped world of self-preoccupation into a more expansive place of fellowship, of true kinship.

Compassion is God. All we are asked to do is to be in the world who God is. Outcast. Victim and victimizer. Sheep without a shepherd. Just assume the answer to every question is compassion.

"We can pour out our love on others because God has poured out His love on us".

Alice Inoue, in her article, A Mindful Moment, "I'm Here for You" says we want to say something comforting yet often end up not really helping. Saying "It will be okay" or "You're going to be fine" denies the painful outcome your friend is fearing. Saying "I know how you feel" is not helpful either, since you really don't. "Everything happens for a reason" is also not appropriate. What to say instead? Something like, "I'm here for you" or "How can I help? Shows solid support.

John 3:18 Little children, let us stop just saying we love people; let us really love them, and show it by our actions.

Remember Mother's Day and Father's Day in May and June. Are you able to say the right thing?



# 200<sup>th</sup> AHA PAE'AINA Annual Meeting of the Hawaii Conference June 17-18, 2022, Central Union Church

2022 'Aha Makua Information

Location Central Union Church, 1660 S. Beretania Street, Honolulu.

Keynote This year's keynote speaker will be Dr. Jeffrey "Kapali" Lyon, Chair of the Department Speaker of Religion at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. He graduated with a BA from Biola University in both ancient Greek and Biblical literature, received a MA and PhD in Near Eastern Languages and Literatures from UCLA, and a MA in Hawaiian language and literature from the Hawaiian Language College at the University of Hawai'i, Hilo. In recent years, Dr. Lyon's research has focused on the first Christian missions to Hawai'i, early Hawaiian Christianity, translations of the Bible into Eastern Polynesian languages, and 19th century Hawaiian language accounts of pre-Christian Hawaiian culture and religion.. A major agent of change was the missionaries who came to Hawai'i in April 1820 to spread the Gospel, and in the process, the islands were forever changed. Nearly everyone who spends much time in Hawai'i soon forms an opinion about "the missionaries" who, as many accounts have it, cajoled, browbeat, and, eventually, converted an entire "heathen" nation to Protestant Christianity. But how could a handful of overdressed New Englanders who, when they first arrived, did not know the native language or culture, convince an entire nation to put on more clothes, adopt western views of sin and sexuality, and replace their traditional Polynesian religion for that of Boston? Could there be more to the story?
