

## MODERATOR'S NOTES

Your moderator attended the Oahu Association meeting called the Mokupuni on May 21, 2022. Irene Willis Hassan was ordained during the Mokupuni through the Church of the Crossroads. She is inspiring and gives us hope for the future of the Christian Church in this country, and more specifically the UCC. She is currently serving at the UCC national office in Cleveland, Ohio helping to serve and welcome and relocate refugees into our country.

The business issue discussed at the Mokupuni was whether the Hawaii Conference of the UCC would support the Tri-Isle Association's proposal to expand the acceptability of pastors for churches who are not fully ordained and have not completed four years of undergraduate studies and three years of seminary training. Many of the churches in Hawaii are unable to find and retain such pastoral candidates. The rule changed to exclude the non-fully ordained pastors from serving in the UCC just prior to the commencement of the pandemic, and the Tri-Isle Association would like it to go back to the looser standard. Most people at the Mokupuni sounded like they agreed with the broader less restrictive requirements for pastors in the UCC.

During the course of this discussion, we learned that there are nine people from Hawaii who are connected with UCC churches who are currently in seminary and who will be looking for full time employment soon. Seven of them, however, are more inclined to serve as a

chaplain and not serving as a pastor in a church. There was lots of speculation as to why these seminarians may not be interested in serving as a pastor of a church.

The annual meeting of the Hawaii Conference will be conducted June 12-18, 2022, via Zoom. I plan to attend portions of the Aha Makua meeting as well.

We are currently being approached by other churches in our area who are interested in sharing our property and making better use of our facilities. While we have made it clear that we are not interested in selling the KCC property to one of these interested parties, we are exploring these partnering options to expand the use of the property for Christian church purposes. We will keep you posted.

We are also forming a new Pastoral Search Committee (PSC) so that we can proceed with retaining a settled pastor for KCC. The four current Council members are already on the PSC.

We need four more members from the congregation to form the PSC. Once the PSC is formed decisions can be made regarding pursuit and retention of our new pastor. Let us know if you are interested in serving in this capacity.

# PENTECOST

Pentecost, June 5th is a special day of worship. The feast marks the end of the Easter season and commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. The Church of God, which began on Pentecost which we read about in Acts 2 is given the mission of preaching the Good News of the Kingdom of God.

As you celebrate Pentecost consider the color red that reminds us of the tongues of fire that descended upon those early disciples as they knew that they must go into the world to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. We are called to continue the work of the Great Commission like those who were energized on that first Pentecost when the Holy Spirit filled those present and three thousand people were saved and they laid down their lives in order that we might continue to continue as the Body of Christ, the Church.

It seems concerning to see so many Christians worrying in fear over the economy...or wars... or pandemics. Paralyzed from moving towards a hopeful future. As we head into this season of Pentecost, we invite you to realize ...God has already given us the victory!

Instead of hanging your head in despair or waiting for help from the government, you can model the amazing testimony of the faith-filled woman described in Proverbs 31:10-31:

Strength and dignity are her clothing, and **she smiles at the future** (v. 25 NASB).

Just as God did for this virtuous woman ...

**God wants to strengthen YOU, so you can SMILE at your future!**

When you make the Lord your dwelling place amid life's storms and shakings, you can rest confidently in His provision, smiling instead of

fretting! The Scriptures promise: "A thousand may fall at your side, and ten thousand at your right hand; but it shall not come near you" (Psalm 91:7).

This means looking to God as your hope and source – not to the resources or news headlines of the world.

## Why Did She Smile?

This woman was confident in God's provision for her future. She trusted Him and was not fearful and helpless. We're told she buys a field and "plants a vineyard" (v. 16). And as the Lord blesses her, she determines to be a blessing to others: "She extends her hand to the poor, and she stretches out her hands to the needy" (v. 20 NASB).

As God has blessed you, you have been a blessing to others (Genesis 12:2).

In the same way, God blessed this woman in Proverbs 31, He promises to bless you abundantly because of your outreach to the least and the lost: "He who has pity on the poor lends to the Lord, and He will pay back what he has given" (Proverbs 19:17).

God will *pay you back* for every seed you've sown – abundantly and overflowing (Luke 6:38)!

You and I have a choice to make. We can choose to live in fear under the world's challenges or we can choose to live in faith...in a covenant relationship with God who has blessed us over and over again.

We need a *new* Pentecost – a fresh outpouring of God's Spirit today. We still are called to lift the name of Jesus and turn the world upside down for Him. God wants to use us to fill the whole earth with the knowledge of His glory (Habakkuk 2:14), reaping an end-time harvest from "every tribe, language, people, and nation" (Revelation 5:9 NASB)!

May we faithfully let Him use us in mighty ways to His glory!


