## WORSHIP NEWS

On October 18-20, 2022, from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm



each evening, Hawaii Island Ministries (HIM) will be conducting its "Worship in the Spirit" worship leaders conference in person at the Ko'olau Ballrooms at the First Presbyterian Church here on the windward side of Oahu. For those of you on our Worship Team or those who have an interest in participating in the worship leadership at KCC, we would encourage you to attend. HIM puts on these conferences very well and they are a very good resource for us to access to improve our worship services. Please let us know if you are interested in attending.

In the not-so-distant past we have had numerous enhancements to worship including: a dance team, a drama team, music leader team, King's Company, the children's message, fellowship & refreshments, the sound system team, PowerPoint presenters, ushers and greeters, worship leaders, sanctuary managers, flower providers and nursery care givers. All of that has been disrupted significantly by the pandemic and our Worship Team shifted primarily to a Zoom & Media Ministry audio-visual operation for over two years. It looks like we can now see light at the end of the tunnel, and we may be coming back to worshipping primarily in the sanctuary again and reinstituting many of these prior worship ministries.

Along the way we have learned how to do worship in person and online and we plan to continue to do that indefinitely.

We are also re-evaluating the audio-visual equipment changes that we have been announcing at church and in the newsletter. We probably won't be acquiring two large TV's to be mounted on the walls at the front of the sanctuary, because they probably won't be large enough for our needs. Instead, we will be continuing to use a large screen in the front of the sanctuary and possibly upgrading our projector. We will keep you posted. We are grateful for the ongoing good technical assistance that we have been receiving from Pat Pai and Aaron Tanaka and Andrew Vallejo-Sanderson and Barney Pilla as we seek to make these audio-visual equipment improvements.

In addition to the pastors who have come back several times to fill our pulpit and provide us messages that are easy to receive and comfortable to hear, we are also becoming exposed to guest speakers with whom we are not familiar. We may be hearing messages that are not as comfortable to receive. Jesus preached many messages that were awkward and uncomfortable for his recipients, including perhaps his most famous sermon, the Sermon on the Mount. With that in mind, let's continue to be open and welcoming and receptive to messages that we may not be familiar with. We are grateful for all of the pastors who have shown a willingness to serve on our behalf and for their contributions to KCC.

- Foodland reserves the right to refuse participation of any non-profit organization.


