#### GRATITUDE

Luke 17:16 He fell on his face at Jesus" feet and thanked him. He was a Samaritan.

Author, Reshmisadhana Y. R. (Tamil Nadu, India) writes:

"In today's scripture reading, Luke 17:12-19, ten men with a skin disease stood at a distance and "raised their voices" to Jesus, crying out for mercy. At that time these people would have been made to live on the outskirts of the city because of their disease. When they heard the news that Jesus could heal the sick, they came to him. Jesus asked them to show themselves to the priests. On their way to the temple, all ten men were healed. But one man came back to thank Jesus. He fell at Jesus' feet, expressing his gratitude and praising God.

"Inspired by this man who expressed gratitude, I try to give thanks to God for every blessing I have received – even the smallest ones. When I travel by bus from college back to my hostel, I start thanking God. There are times when I forget to give thanks, like the days when I fall sick or when I have examinations, yet those days never feel complete."

"So often we are ready to do what God says, but we cannot hear God's word because we are far away. We fail to see the distance that is created by our lack of gratitude. To reduce the distance between God and us, we can start giving thanks. The more we give thanks, the closer we get to God."

## INTERCESSORY PRAYER FOR THE NATION OF MYANMAR

Please join us and Pastor Rick & Diane Bartosik as we pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ in that country. Please pray for their mission partners Chhuana and his wife, Lunpi who serve there.

Myanmar has been in chaos for the past two years since the military take-over of the country in February 2021. Suu Kyi's democratically elected government was decimated as the leaders, including Suu Kyi, were thrown into prison.

The United Nations has accused the military of war crimes and crimes against humanity. The United

States and our allies have imposed sanctions on the nation.

The people of Myanmar are continuing to endure a political, human rights, health, economic and humanitarian crisis that has caused many civilian casualties and displacement.

At least 1.5 million people have been displaced across Myanmar. 70,000 people have fled the country. People live in daily fear for their safety and their lives.

Last year alone, 19,000 people were killed in clashes with the military forces.humanity.

PRAYER REQUESTS FROM PASTOR LAL RAWNA: (Lal Rawna is President of the

Evangelical Free Church of Myanmar with headquarters in Kalay, near the border with India) He is asking for prayer for the country of Myanmar, for protection for their people and for the wisdom to know how to help in such adverse conditions.

1. Sekan village just 15 minutes from the church in Kalay (near the border with India) was attacked and burned by the military. At least 70 homes were burned to the ground including the home of an elderly retired pastor, Rev. Than Linga, who lost everything. Pray for his health.

2. A number of families from the villages where the military has attacked now face not only dire poverty, but even starvation.

3. Displaced families are being provided with shelter, food, and health care by Pastor Rawna and the church in Kalay.

4. Pray for wisdom and strength to respond to those in need.

5. Pray for the safety of the Christians who keep hearing explosions, gun shots, and burning houses all around. They are afraid to leave their homes.

6. Pray for God's intervention to bring peace and order to Myanmar.

7. Pastor Rawna writes: "We praise God that we have you as our prayer partners! God bless you richly for your prayer partnership and generosity."
