Excitement is Building for Summer at KCC!

Summer is just around the corner, and we are thrilled to share what God is doing in and through our church during this upcoming season of growth, creativity, and connection.

We are prayerfully preparing to welcome our next group of Pastoral Interns, and this year we've expanded the program to include five incredible participants! You can read about each of them in this newsletter, and we invite you to get to know them and lift them in prayer as they prepare to serve with us.

The primary focus of the internship this summer will be to host our very first **Summer Keiki Drama Camp**, taking place **July 21–August 2**. This two-week camp will offer keiki the opportunity to learn stage performance skills and engage with the spiritual story behind *The Lion*, *the Witch, and the Wardrobe*—a play rooted deeply in Christian symbolism and the story of Christ's love and sacrifice.

Our hope is that the Drama Camp becomes more than just a fun summer activity. We want it to be a vital resource for families seeking affordable, meaningful, and enriching summer childcare—a space where children can grow not only in confidence and creativity, but also in their understanding of faith and the message of Jesus. We also believe this camp is a bridge—one that connects our church more deeply to our community. We are planting seeds of relationships that we pray will take root and flourish, bearing fruit not just for our church, but for the families of Kailua and beyond.




